The Coode St. Press, Eidolon Publications, MirrorDanse Books and

Ticonderoga Publications - launched Antique Futures: The Best of Ferry Dowling a big fat trade paperback collecting the best of Dowling's stories with a sturning cover by Nick Stathopoulos and a stirring intro by Jack Dann. The book sold out its initial print run at the Convention and is going back to press shortly.

The other one was a new critical magazine that Steve Paulsen and I are doing: The Coode Street Review of Science Fiction. It's a new quarterly review of OZSF, with columns by Russell 3lackford, Simon Brown, Justine Larbalestier, Chris Lawson, Dave uckett, Robin Pen and others. The debut issue did pretty well at the on, though the t-shirt seemed to be in more demand.

Damon Dark

Adrian Sherlock reports "Thursday, September 9, 1999 at 11 pm, Science Fiction television history was made, when Channel 11 screened *Damon Dark* Episode One, "Time Slip". Made entirely in Melbourne the episode was definitive SF, featuring aliens and time travel. Unlike other Australian sf, Damon Dark received an MA ating. (Mature Audiences). This makes it the first adult hard-core SF series ever produced in Australia. And it has already attracted he interest of talented people who want to help it grow. Two local of fan writers are considering writing episodes. George Ivanoff who appears briefly in Episode 2, has a script idea and is keen to ceappear in the series as an actor. Sian O'Neale is considering writing a possible vampire episode. The next series has the

commitment of a professional camera man and editor. Series 2 will be completely digital. Six more episodes, written by Adrian Sherlock, are being prepared for shooting and the cast are keen to reprise their roles. Following the recent Aussiecon Three screenings, the approach to the series will be modified slightly, aiming for balance of humour and drama.
