# George Turner Prize

Bantam Books have sent out entry forms for the third George Turner Prize Competition. It is for unpublished fantasy or science fiction manuscripts by Australian residents. Works should be between 60,000 and 150,000 words. There is an entry fee of \$30. The prize is \$10,000, which is an advance against royalties. The deadline is 5:00pm, January 28 2000. The judging panel will be chaired by Fiona Henderson. Entry forms are available from The George Turner Prize, Transworld Division, Random House Australia Pty Ltd, 20 Alfred St, Milson's Point, NSW 2061.

#### Damien Broderick in New Zealand

Damien Broderick notes "I had the great good fortune and pleasure to be invited to Auckland at the end of September to be a keynote speaker (with Dr Jack Cohen, who has designed some of the best aliens in sf and written fascinating theoretical work with mathematician Dr lan Stewart) at BioLive '99, a conference of NZ biology teachers. More recently, I gave an invited public address at the Victoria University of Technology on matters Spikish and Last Mortal, briefly exploring the prospects of humanity in an epoch of accelerating technology.

Meanwhile, my study of recent science fiction, Transrealist Fiction: Writing in the Slipstream of Science is being edited at Greenwood Press, USA, for July 2000 release, and a new YA sf novel by Rory Barnes and me, Hell's Teeth, is under submission."

Chris Collier of Australia. In reply to the question of who
Chris is, Forry replied "A loner who's been extremely kind

# Foyster's Origins Unmasked

Leigh Edmonds posted this to the Australian fanhistory mailing list. "A little footnote to fannish history. Last weekend Valma and I were at a conference about the history of local newspapers in Chiltern. Not a bad event in its way, but if you've published a newszine none of the problems of publishing local newspapers are new to you. I happened to mention this to one of the other speakers during lunch and to my amazement he used the term fanzine as though everyone knew it well.

"You'd know Max Foyster then,"he said. I looked blank for a second and then recalled that the fine fellow we

know as John Foyster is aka Max Foyster to many family and friends.

"Indeed," I replied, "We've published the occasional fanzine."

"Well, I'm responsible for him... for him being involved in science fiction."

The story unfolds that in 1955 when John Foyster was sick in bed he wanted something to read and my informant supplied him with the hard stuff, some copies of stf magazines. And the rest if history, as they say. I have the informant's card. He's Dr Thomas Darragh, Senior Curator in Invertebrate Palaeontology at the Museum of Victoria." [Why am I not surprised that someone with details of John Foyster's pre-history would have something to do with palaeontology?]
