The competition is open only to *unpublished* writers, defined as those who have never received *money* for a *published* piece of *prose fiction* -- articles & poetry don't count. Details are available on the SFWOE Website, though entrants should be careful to download

the forms for Australasian residents, as it's much cheaper. This year Picaro Press is helping to sponsor the competition by adjusting the entry fee to compensate for the sad state of the Australian dollar, and providing an Australian address to avoid overseas postage costs. The top ten list is generally published in _Locus__SF Chronicle_ and other genre magazines. The winner will be offered publication either in _Altair_ (if it survives) or on the SFWoE Website, though this is voluntary -- entrants are welcome to sell their stories any way they can *after* submitting. The competition judge will probably be Edward Bryant, and results will be available at the end of January 2002.
