
#### Who Says I Don't Publish Tasmanian News? (Albeit a trifle late)

Niall Doran reports " As mentioned by Robin Johnson, ThylaXene is a collection of 10 new SF stories, varying quite widely in style and setting, written by myself, Stuart Newman and Craig Wellington. It is published by our small press publishing group, Desdichado Publishing, and retails at \$12.95; copies will also be supplied by mail within Australia for that price (i.e. postage free; cheques to Desdichado Publishing. P.O. Box 310, Sandy Bay, Tasmania, 7006). It will also be sold in combination with "Chronological Adventures of Detrius Thesper" for \$20.

The book was launched by Robin Johnson at the Tasmanian Museum and Art Gallery on 6.3.97, in front of the museum's thylacine display, with the museum also bringing some of its most prized specimens (such as the preserved thylacine foetus) out for the event. Preceding the official launch was a media launch, to which the media had been duped into turning up by an official-looking museum fax stating that

"The Tasmanian Tiger will live again! Find out more and the latest on cloning and the status of DNA technology at the Tasmanian Museum and Art Gallery on..." ...and in small print at the bottom (probably not even legible on the fax) it said "...coinciding with the launch of a

#### new Tasmanian book, ThylaXene...)

The media frenzy that erupted was something to behold. As soon as the fax went out, the museum started to get enquiries from a multitude of media outlets - from Tasmania's suburban papers to The Age - all believing they had cloned a tiger (which is actually the thrust of the main story in the anthology). The museum made no statement beyond "come and see", and Craig (who's been in advertising, publicity & the media for 10 years) said that we should hope for at least one print, one radio and one TV crew so that we covered all the mediums. To his amazement, EVERYBODY turned up - it was the biggest media turnout he had seen. We had all of the Tasmanian newspapers, all of the radio stations, three television news crews, The Australian, The Age, Triple J... the list goes on. In all, there were at least 15 different media outlets represented, and several more who couldn't make it requesting information be sent to them. The museum was envious, as their own publicity has never generated a turnout like that! The serendipitous news of Dolly the sheep had certainly worked to our advantage ... all we had to do now was avoid being lynched.

Fortunately, most of the journalists took the hoax in their stride and in the spirit it was intended, although the reporter from The Age raised his eyes to the heavens when he realised he was at a book launch. As for the reporting, again we did quite well, turning up in a respectable proportion of the papers, radio, and TV shows that were there (after spending an hour of news gathering time with us, I guess they had to report something!). We hit the front page of the Mercury (after a near full page review and photo in the same paper earlier in the week), page 2 of the Advocate, the evening news and late night update on WIN (we don't know about the other stations), an afternoon interview about the launch and an evening debate on the ethics and financial allure of cloning (proclaimed as being "sparked by the new publication ThylaXene") were held on ABC radio, the Examiner had an article on the possibilities of cloning thylacines which neglected to mention - but was obviously inspired by - us (sour grapes perhaps?), Triple JJJ and local radio ran with thylacine cloning discussions and news items for several days (including interviews with Tasmanian academics in molecular biology who must've wondered what had suddenly stirred up all the interest), and The Mercury and The Examiner had a run of thylacine related cartoons. Several other publications and programs have gone to press and air that may have mentioned us (we know the Western Herald did, but haven't seen it). As far as I know, we didn't make the Age or the Australian, but we can live with that.

As a post-script, yesterday (25.3.97) I was at the Zoology Department of the University of Tasmania, and a WIN TV news car pulled in the car park ahead of me. The reporter recognised me (she had covered the launch) and gave me a wave alongside a slightly bemused smile. When I saw the evening bulletin, I found out that there had been an alleged sighting of a thylacine in Indonesia, and they had come to interview a Zoology lecturer about the chances of it being legitimate (virtually nil). To back the interview with him, they used file footage of the display at the museum - footage which obviously came from the launch as our silhouettes could be seen reflected in the glass. But what amuses me the most is what went through her mind when she spotted me in the car park: she must have suspected they had been duped again!.... "

And, in a further postscript from Niall " ThylaXene is available from Galaxy in Sydney as well as Slow Glass in Melbourne and should be invading other mainland bookshops in the not too distant future... As for ThylaXene itself, it seems we've sparked something that just won't go away. On March 27, a letter was printed in The Mercury from Dr Jeremy Austin, a Research Fellow at the Natural History Museum in London. The letter was responding to the front page article on the launch (God knows how he ended up seeing it!), mentioning our book and discussing the feasibility of cloning thylacines and other extinct animals from remnant DNA. A follow up letter from myself on behalf of Desdichado Publishing was printed on April 4, the same day that another sighting (this time in Tasmania) was being reported in the paper and other outlets. And today, the tiger's in the paper again! The ball just keeps rolling ... '


