This is not done via the normal Ditto Master. As an experiment, I'm using Hecto carbons. If this works, there is only one thing for those who are thinking of doing likewise, only one thing they must remember. The hecto carbon must be placed facing the master sheet, leaving a reverse image on the back of the sheet you have selected as a master. I have further suggestions, but must first see how it turns out. I also am using TWO carbons, in an attempt to make TWO masters at once, don't think that the hecto master would cover 250 copies like the ditto master. For those who think I'm sick, well, let me assure you that I am. I must be. MARSOLO (16 pages) 100 copies. Synergetics - 5 pages - 300 copies. BULIZINE - 36 pages - 250 copies - Pack Rat - 12 pages - 250 copies - Memoritor- 5 pages, 50 copies - MINDJEE- 14 pages, 100 copies. A total of 68 pages, for a total copy of 1050. Figure it out for yourself. And more to come as soon as this is out of the way.
