They visited fans in Wellington and Norsewood, New Zealand; Collie, Western Australia; Adelaide; Melbourne; Canberra and Sydney, as well as attending the Australian Natcon in Perth, before returning home April 25.

NOMINATIONS OPEN FOR 1994 & '95

Nominations are now open for the next two DUFF races. In 1994, a fan from Australia or New Zealand will attend Conadian, the 52nd World Science Fiction Convention, Sept. 1-5, in Winnipeg, Manitoba. The following year, a North American will go to Thylacon, the 1995 Australian National Convention, June 10-12, in Hobart, Tasmania. So far, one fan has expressed an interest in the '94 race.

Many fans told us they would have voted differently in some earlier races had they known that a candidate had previously visited the other continent. Other fans don't feel this makes any difference, but it seemed only fair to let the voters make an informed choice.

Candidates must provide:

- 1) A 100-word platform.
- 2) A brief statement of any previous visits to the host country and fannish contact while there. (For example: "My mother took me to Melbourne for two weeks in 1954, when I was 5. We didn't meet any fans." Or, "I was in the US for four months in 1978 and two in 1982, attended Iguanacon and Chicon IV, and visited fans in Los Angeles, Denver, Seattle, Cincinnati and Milwaukee.")
- 3) Five nominations, three from one's own continent and two from the host. (Couples can count as one or two, as they choose.)
- 4) A non-refundable bond of US\$20 or A\$30.

In an effort to facilitate publication of as many outstanding reports as possible, Dick and Leah offer to handle publishing for any laggard DUFF report writers. All you need to do is type the thing up, and they'll take care of printing and distribution. The SCIFI offer extends only to published reports, so slide shows aren't eligible for the bounty. However, if anyone who did a slide report will lend the pictures to Dick and Leah along with a transcript of their talk they'll take care of transforming it into a publication.

We'd like to put together a DUFF archives containing all the completed reports and any other DUFF paraphernalia we can get our hands on (buttons, ballots, newsletters, electioneering fanzines, etc.) This would be passed from administrator to administrator and possibly displayed a Worldcons.

It would be great to have two sets -- one for either side of the Pacific -- but one is better than none. If any one has any of this material that they would care to donate, please send it to Dick and Leah. Future DUFFistorians will thank you.



We don't suggest that you stop giving to TAFF, but please, if

you're going to divide a donation between the two funds, consider the difference between the cost of a round trip between North America and Great Britain and the price of traveling between North America and Australasia. (From Chicago to Sydney right now is about \$1,300, compared to less than \$700 for Chicago to London -- almost double!)

Please -- for every \$1 you give to TAFF, give \$2 to DUFF.


