Have you ever just picked up a dictionary and thumbed through it for no particular reason? I did that a few years ago and under DUFF I found a couple of listings. One of them caught my eye: as a verb, an Australian term meaning to steal and/or alter the brand on cows or horses. This is probably of no interest to anybody else, but at least it gives me a somewhat memorable name for a newsletter.

The 1998 DUFF race is over. On May 2nd (in my time zone) Perry Middlemiss and I compiled the following numbers:

Therefore, Terry Frost wins the opportunity to represent Australian fandom at the 1998 Worldcon (Bucconeer) in Baltimore from August 5th through August 9th. It is customary for DUFF winners to see as much of the host country (or continent) as possible during his or her trip. I will try to keep you informed of the upcoming expedition. I understand that a lot of people in North America didn't feel knowledgeable enough about the two candidates in this race to vote. I am glad to see that seventeen people chose the No Preference option, which is precisely what it's there for. (Thank you for not voting.)

Insofar as the next race will send a North American fan to AussieCon 3, I don't think I'll have too much difficulty finding qualified candidates. Four people have already expressed an interest in standing. Therefore, I expect the next race will have stricter deadlines and a longer voting period.

In the interests of making voting easier for non-USA fans, I am now able to accept checks (or cheques) written on foreign bank accounts. It is probably a lot easier for my bank to handle these cheques than it is for fans from another country to get a bank draft in US funds. I've heard horror stories of banks charging the equivalent of \$30 for a \$10 money order and I know my bank can do better than that. Canadian cheques shouldn't present a problem for a Seattle bank, since Canada is just up the street.
