#### BIG NEWS --- A CLUBHOUSE AT LAST

This issue is intended to reach for more people than is usual for an issue of De Profundis. We've made an effort to find the addresses of all people who might be interested in the news that, at long last, after 39 years in fact, the Los Angeles Science Fantasy Society has finally found a permanent home, a clubhouse we own, one that is all ours. You may find this news of little interest now, but LASFS, once upon a time, was important to you. It has changed, of course -- everything changes. But the club still serves the same function for the current membership as it did for the membership of your time.

We don't ask that once again you make LASFS attendance a regular habit -- that's for you to decide. But <u>please</u> attend the first meeting in our own clubhouse. In one way or another, this is something <u>you</u> worked for, and we invite you to see what we have. The first meeting in the clubhouse will be the club's anniversary meeting, October 25th, Thursday night, at 8:00, just like always. The address is 11360 Ventura Boulevard.

The clubhouse can be reached easily from the Hollywood Freeway, Northbound, by taking the Ventura Boulevard offramp; turn right at the bottom of the ramp and proceed to 11360. Southbound on the same freeway, take the Vineland offramp, turn right onto Vineland, and right again at the first light, onto Ventura. Westbound on the Ventura Freeway, take the Laurel Canyon Boulevard offramp, turn left and go to Ventura Boulevard, turn left at that corner, and proceed to the clubhouse. Eastbound on the Ventura Freeway, take the Laurel Canyon Boulevard offramp, turn right onto Laurel Canyon, and left at Ventura. By bus: the 81 line from Hollywood or from out in the Valley goes along Ventura Boulevard. The 93 line from Downtown or Pacoima goes to Vineland & Ventura; get off at that corner.

The clubhouse is on the South side of the street, against a hill. It is one story, stucco, with a black metal railing & baffles on the windows. Please arrive by eight o'clock since the nightclub across the street fills up most street parking by 9:30; do not park in the supermarket parking lot.

Even if you never attend another LASFS meeting or any other fan function, please attend this meeting, the most important in the history of the club. The LASFS has a home now.

# MORE CLUBHOUSE NEWS

Just because we now have a clubhouse, our debts are not over. To make the price of the building, we had to borrow \$7,000.00 from various members and organizations. Furthermore, we will need money all the time anyway -- for taxes, maintenance, taxes, insurance, taxes, food for parties, taxes, to buy books for the library, etc. taxes etc. taxes etc. No donation is too small, no donation is too large, and all donations are completely tax-deductible. In fact, a donation of \$500.00 or more will make you a Patron Saint, and you will get a plaque saying so, and will be able to choose a meeting out of the year for your very own -- it will thereafter be Saint Your Day.

Furthermore, the LASFS is buying padded folding chairs for the clubhouse, and is requesting endowments of chairs, to defray some of the cost. For \$8.00, a sign will be placed on the back of the chair reading "This Chair Donated By..."whoever; you can endow a chair in your name or in the name of anyone you wish -- including hoaxes, objects, or anything.

Also, it would be nice if someone bought subscriptions to all the SF magazines in the name of the LASFS and to be mailed to our current address. However, please check with us to find out if someone has beaten you to it. Furthermore, we hope that fanzine editors will send us their zines for inclusion in the LASFS library.

If you (whoever you might be) have anything at all belonging to the LASFS, now is the time to bring it to the clubhouse -- preferably to the first meeting. We now have a place for everything and want to put everything in its place. Note: this does not yet apply to material in/for the library -- that is not yet ready for installation.

Until we can buy a stove, we would like to borrow or be given a hot plate and tea kettle. We are also looking for an icebox or a refrigerator. And we are possibly interested in buying a used or reconditioned mimeograph, possibly also a ditto machine.

It has been suggested that the clubhouse be made a permanent floating art gallery, displaying (for sale) works by local fan artists, with bid sheets a la convention art shows. If you are a fan artist interested in this idea, come to a meeting and talk about it with Board Chairman Milt Stevens.

We could also use donations of paper plates, plastic drinking cups, plastic tableware, etc. Further calls for donations will go out as needed things are decided upon.
