THE TWENTY-FIRST THRU TWENTY-FOURTH YEARS

FAPA MAILINGS NUMBER 81, NOVEMBER 1957, THRU 96, AUGUST 1961

In the introductory material to the index section covering the 65th thru 80th Fapa mailings--Fapa's 17th thru 20th years--I quoted the opening lines of Lewis Carroll's "The Hunting of the Snark," which begins: "The crew was complete."

It would be almost equally appropriate to quote those same opening lines for this section, covering Fapa's 21st thru 24th years, for the "crew" remained remarkably constant. Normal Fapa membership turnover is about three or four persons per mailing. During the four years we're now concerned with, Fapa's turnover was 33 people, or an average of two persons per mailing. Nor does this mean that Fapa lost half of its prior membership, for the turnover of 33 people actually involved only 20 membership spaces. The other 45 people who were members of Fapa as of the 81st mailing retained their membership throughout the period.

Mailings of the two periods are similar in style and content. They would be: much of the mailings came from the same people. The size of the mailings was also much the same--526 pages per average Fapa mailing for mailings 65 thru 80 versus 523 pages on the average for mailings 81 thru 96; a meaningless difference considering the variable nature of that basic unit of measure, the "page." Some records were set. The old record of 747 pages in the total mailing, counting postmailings, was held by the 74th mailing, and that record stood, its nearest challenger being 678 pages in the 89th mailing. The prior record of 609 pages in the mailing at the time of dispatch (before postmailings) was exceeded by both the 89th mailing, with 655 pages, and the 92nd, with 618 pages.

One of the oddities of the period is that, with one single exception, the fans who joined Fapa in this four-year span did not stay in Fapa for a particularly long time. Bruce Pelz, who joined with the last mailing of this group, the 96th, is the only member who joined during this time who remained continuously in Fapa through 1977. Shucks, we have more than that left from Fapa's first four years!

The low membership turnover had its impact on the waiting list. At the time of the 65th mailing, November 1953, the waiting list was a mere thirteen people long. Its size grew to eighteen in November 1954, thirty-one in November 1955, and thirty-four in November 1956. It varied between thirty-one and thirty-nine through August 1959, finally reaching into the forties--to forty-three--in November 1959 and then to fifty in August 1960. As the period ends with the August 1961 mailing, the waiting list is at its up-till-then high of fifty-three.

This period is noted for the number of people in almost every mailing. Warner, or course. But also Evans, McPhail, GM Carr, Caughran, White, Economou, Calkins, Eney, Danner, and Bradley. Nor is that an exhaustive list. Tucker and Morse should be added, for while they didn't publish for every mailing, they were in close to every mailing through columns in magazines that were: Tucker in Vandy and Morse in Phlotsam. They were good years. The people that made it happen are listed on the next two pages.

THE TWENTY-FIRST YEAR, 1957-1958

The candidates for office were:

Which was odd, in its own little way. Eney succeeded himself. Pavlat and Evans swapped jobs. And White got the job which McCain had beat him out of the year before.

It was to be a good year. The mailings, while substantial, were not overwhelming in size, varying as they did from 423 to 607 pages, with an average of 526. Quality was quite high, and many members were present in each of the four mailings.

FAPA MAILING #81 - November 1957

Members added were Brandon, Gerding, Morse, and Stark. Graham, Harmon, and Labowitz\* were the ex-members. The Brandon/Graham situation deserves special mention. Carl Brandon was the joint pen-name of several west coast fans, including Carr, Elik, and to some minor extent Graham. Brandon had been on the waiting list for his allotted years, but the fans behind the pen-name didn't want to waste a Fapa space on a pen-name. (Few fans knew that Brandon was a pen-name, and most Fapans did not learn that fact until November 1958, following the Solacon.) By common agreement the membership of Pete Graham as a Fapa member was allowed to lapse through non-payment of dues following the 80th mailing, and Graham operated as Brandon in Fapa in terms of dues and receipt of mailings. In November 1958, when the hoax was blown, the Brandon membership was converted to Graham, so in reality the Graham membership was continuous from November 1952, when he first joined, through the Brandon membership and back to his own membership.                      \*and Gould.

A new Fapa Constitution had been brewing, and was put up for vote with this mailing. The first constitution had been adopted in 1937, a revised constitution in 1947, and it was now 1957 - plus a couple of months. The constitution was adopted, and it's basically the one we operate under here in 1977. It was written by Speer; Warner, Tucker, Eney, Evans, and others helped, Warner with a full review, the others with beneficial suggestions; Pavlat coordinated the re-write.

The Interplanetary rules were based on the game developed by Art Widner in the 1940's. Evans, White, and Pavlat played the game at many meetings of the Washington group and simplified the rules somewhat, basically to speed up the game. The commercial game of Interplanetary is not the Widner game (I vaguely recall de Jack as the inventor), and is a greatly inferior game.

FAPA MAILING #83 - May 1958

The only membership change was the loss of Larry Anderson. The mailing ran to 568 pages at the time of dispatch--big for then or any other time but shy of the record 590 and 609 pages in the 78th and 79th mailings. Mailings were assembled at Eney's in these pre-Jiffy-bag days and many was the yard of string used in tying the envelopes then used. I believe that it was the Youngs who discovered and used Jiffy-bags for Fapa mailings while they were OE in 1959-60.

The old guard tromped on, making room for only ten new members through the year. We also started seeing the inevitable result of admitting married couples to membership--the fact that they didn't always remain married.

Activity for the year totaled 1626 pages, the lowest since the 1952-1953 Fapa year.

FAPA MAILING #85 - November 1958

Added to the membership were Pete Graham, the Coulsons, Dick Geis, and John Trimble. Dropped were Carl Brandon, John Murdock, Wilfried Myers, and Vernon McCain. The Graham-Brandon exchange was, as noted before, essentially a continuation of a single membership.

It has been many months since I assembled the information for the listing above. I wondered as I was typing the above whether OE White had yet moved to Baltimore. He had; I remember well writing my line or two for Sex & Sadism at the White's Baltimore apartment; but it wasn't till I hit that entry in the listing that I could recall where the assembly session was. Eney (OE 1956-57, 1957-58), White (OE 1958-59), and the Youngs (OE 1959-60) all held assembly parties, several of which drew fair crowds--I can recall the Shaws and Silverbergs and Youngs coming to DC for some (and unavoidable absences frequently accounting for the presence of A Fanzine For (person that couldn't make it) in the listings above), and I knew that both Eney and I made it up to the Youngs (Cambridge, Mass) for assembly sessions. There was a bit of shifting around--White and Eney each hosted at least one while the other was OE, and I hosted one or possibly two while one or the other of them was OE. I guess it won't hurt any feelings if I admit that I mostly looked forward to the sessions at Eney's. His mother is a really superb cook. But they were all fun.

FAPA MAILING #87 - May 1959

Madle in, Geis out. Shaw membership split, resulting in separate memberships for Larry Shaw and Lee Shaw. (Lee returned to her maiden name of Lee Hoffman with the 88th mailing.) Splits such as this and junctures such as the Sylvia (Dees) Ted White marriage last mailing make it impossible to maintain an "exact" count of members in and out of Fapa over any particular time period.

FAPA MAILING #88 - August 1959

Two couples were added to Fapa with the 88th mailing, the Busbys and the Linards. Departed since the 87th were Sanderson, Harris, and Jenette. The number of UK members of Fapa had reached a peak with the entrance of Bill Morse in November, 1957. Willis dropped out following the November 1958 mailing, followed six months later by Sanderson and Harris, to be followed (though we didn't know it at the time) twelve months later by Smith, and three months after that by Wansborough. As of this mailing, August 1959, the only UK fan on the waiting list was George Charters, who never made it into Fapa. Oversea residents in Fapa in August 1959 included the Linards from France, Ashworth, Bennett, Morse, Smith, and Wansborough in the UK, and two US citizens residing abroad--Quagliano in Europe and Helen Wesson who'd been in Japan for what seemed like forever.

The mailing went out in two sections. OE White had been forced to move from Baltimore to New York. When he moved--but let me quote Ted, writing in the third person in the FA for mailing 88: "The fact is that though he moved to New York before the mailing deadline, by clever trickery he managed to keep his Baltimore address open for receiving all mail and parcels, and all FAPAZines (with a single exception) were received with no difficulty. (The exception was Ryan's BANDWAGON, which arrived on a Saturday (the Saturday) railway express.) The Railway Express, unfortunately, is not open on Saturdays. ..." Trickery is often trickier than it is clever. On the 22nd of August, less than two weeks later, I sent a card out passing on the news that 11 Fapazines had been received by White (in New York) since the mailing date. My card went on to say that "These magazines will be postmailed about 29 August according to a note received from White today."

Major Fapa mailing foul-ups include the 10th, scheduled for December 1939 but mailed combined with the 11th in March 1940 (caused by the failure of Taurasi to turn over records and funds from his prior term as Secretary-Treasurer); the 12th (Blitzkrieg) mailing (OE Agnew went off to camp, casually ignoring the mailings); the two halves of the 30th (the first half or "Bastard" mailing sent early by OE Shaw (scheduled January 1945, dated November mailed December 1944) the second half scheduled January 1945 mailed February and March 1945 due to Shaw's illness and a lack of funds (funds were advanced from the NFFF through EEEvans.)); and the 40th mailing, scheduled July mailed September 1947 (the culmination of a series of progressively later mailings under OE Perdue, compounded by lack of a report from Secretary-Treasurer Widner, lack of funds, and finally Laney, who with Burbee had taken over the job of getting the mailing out, came down with a summer cold at the same time that funds were advanced by Rothman, delaying the mailing a couple of more days.

Ted White did not get the mailing out on the 29th of August, and the series of incidents that followed moved the 88th mailing into the realm of the classics. At the Detention (September 4th-7th 1959) I asked Ted about the mailing and was told it was ready to go except for funds. On returning home I passed this information onto ST Evans, who promptly sent \$15 to Ted. Quoting from Evans now: "That would have been about Sept 15. Still no mailing." Finally, on Sept 27, Pavlat and I, together with John Magnus and spouse, and an innocently visiting Phil Castora, went to New York for the week-end, mainly to capture the missing bundles and mail them. By a clever trick, Ted avoided us; he chose that week-end to drive to Falls Church (Va) - without mailings, which could have been left with one of the local fans, if he was unable to get them out - and we were unable to complete our task."

Mailing 88 was an election mailing, and on September 29, the Busbys (who were tellers) announced the results, including the election of the Youngs as next OE. That had been a foregone conclusion anyway, since they were running unopposed. Following our abortive visit to NYC, I'd planned to stop in NYC on my way to the Youngs' in November and retrieve the missing section of the mailing for incorporation in the next mailing if Ted had still not mailed it. That turned out to be unnecessary. On October 11, at about 2 a.m., the Youngs were at a party at a neighbor's house in Cambridge. One person at the party evidently was driving to NYC that morning. The Youngs joined the group, and found the Whites at home. A joint one-shot was published to celebrate the occasion, the Youngs returned home that evening, and on October 13 the missing section was mailed. By edict of the President, the magazines in this section are part of the mailing--I've coded them "S" for second section in the listing that follows. But there is a bit more of the story to tell before I get to that listing.

You'll recall that there had been an advance of funds to Ted. Some of that--presumably \$5--had gone for postage due fees on the magazines forwarded from Baltimore to Ted's NYC address. Quoting now from Andy Young's STAND BY FOR REPERCUSSIONS in the 89th mailing: "During my blitz visit to New York, Ted White told me that (being

broke) he had spent the \$10 advance on the postage for the late section of Mlg. 88 on food. He said...that the money would be paid back soon, or before FAPAcon time at least. ... Came the FAPAcon. Came a phone call from the celebrants at (the Philadelphia conference being held that weekend), among whose joyous number was Ted White. Came no word from Ellick saying that the money had been repaid ((Ellick was newly elected ST)). ... Came the thought: it would be but poetic justice to delay Ted's mailing until the debt is repaid, just as he delayed the last half of the 88th mailing." And so it was done.

Needless to say, the dust eventually settled. This extensive detail on Ted's failure in the case of the 88th mailing could create an erroneous impression. Ted had joined Fapa in May, 1955. He was a highly active member, and a good officer. But when Ted does screw up, as he did here, he doesn't stop half way.

Also on the ballot was an important constitutional amendment which, in essence, provided the machinery to remove from the waiting list any person whose presence on the waiting list was objected to by a significant portion of the membership. The amendment passed (45 yes, 5 no, 3 abstentions). The high total of 53 members voting was primarily due to interest in the amendment rather than unusual excitement about the candidates for office.

THE TWENTY-THIRD YEAR, - 1959-1960

Fapa members grimly held on to their memberships. Only six members, none of any particular Fapa importance, left during the year, making room for six newcomers (counting Taurasi, who rejoined after a lapse of many years, as a newcomer). Noreen married in to Larry Shaw and Bjo to John Trimble.

There were 2532 pages in the mailings (with postmailings), bringing the year close to the then-record 2630 pages of Fapa's 20th year - 1956-57. The 2402 pages in the mailings before postmailings were an easy record, the prior high being 2253 pages in 1956-57.

FAPA MAILING #89 - November 1959

Parker in; Gerding out, Noreen joined Larry Shaw's membership. The waiting list, which had been holding in the 30's since November 1955 and which had held 34 names in the last prior mailing shot up by 9 to 43, a new high, the prior high having been 39 at the time of the 80th mailing.
