Vice President's Report

THE LEWIS CASE: Alan Lewis published three pages about December 1963, then six more during the year. Evans didn't allow credit for the three pages. In the August Mailing, Lewis noticed that he was listed as owing two pages, and wrote Bill about it. Bill, in the hospital, didn't answer. Al thought this meant Evans agreed with him, and didn't publish for the November mailing, to ill result. He appealed, on the grounds that Evans's failure to reply constituted an error of an officer.

Dodging this last issue, which is doubtful at best, I go to the FAPA Constitution. "To count," it says, "renewal credentials must be distributed in FAPA mailings or postmailings during the year that ends when the fourth quarterly mailing under the member's current membership is sent out." Though this literally states only a necessary, not a sufficient condition, the intent seems clear enough: a FAPA membership is divided on the date of the fourth mailing. In spite of unfortunate precedent, I can't read this to say anything but that activity distributed during the three months between last and first mailings of successive years goes into the next year. Lewis was restored.

THE SCITHERS CASE: Rich Brown appealed Scithers's position on the waiting list, on the grounds that once resigned, he couldn't change his mind. I wrote the Sec-Treas, as the other party in the dispute, and also sent a letter to Scithers, as an interested bystander who might like to comment.

Pavlat and Evans both pointed out that within the Constitution's "The waiting list shall be maintained by the Secretary-Treasurer..." lies a certain amount of leeway; there is no reason the Sec-Treas cannot take a reasonable amount of time to perform any action, such as accepting a resignation. (I think it has been held that an officer's act is not official until it appears in the FA.)

Accordingly, I wrote Brown suggesting that if he thought an unreasonable amount of time had been taken, he should write the President, who decides on matters not otherwise covered by the Constitution.

Scithers, in the meanwhile, exploded. Let me say only that not presenting one's case to the Vice President will not excuse you on the grounds that he cannot act until two sides have been presented, and suggest that George count to ten before exploding, in the future.

Above ... the egoboo poll results. However, I should confess that, after looking at the first couple of bright orange ballots, I realized that I would go blind before I finished counting the poll. Accordingly, I invented the results.

The 21 Fapans who voted were: Bergeron, Berman, Breen, Brown, Calkins, Caughran, Deckinger, Donaho, Ellingtons, Eney (who asked that votes for him not be counted), Hansen, Hoffman, Jacobs, Lichtman, Moffatt, Morse, Pelz, Sneary, Tucker, Warner, and Wells. Speer's ballot arrived after the votes had been counted. Several others used their blackball priveleges, but did not vote in the poll. Inaccuracies are probable.

Each member of Fapa's long waitlist received ten or more negative votes, and is therefore banished from its ranks, not to re-apply for a year. Apparently the Fapa membership wanted to illustrate Calkins's statement, "... the Constitution does not require that a member have any sort of reason for objecting to the admission of a potential member, let alone a good reason ..."

No members were dropped or added this quarter. Alan Lewis (Portland) was retained in membership despite the absence of 2 pages renewal activity credit. Lewis had thought some material postmailed to the November 1963 mailing would be credited to 1964 (Nov 63-Nov 64) requirements. He wrote Evans concerning the discrepancy in page count in August or so, and receiving no reply (due to Evans' hospitilization and some misunderstanding of the intent of Lewis's query) assumed his credentials were in good shape. They weren't, and I so informed him, in response to a November letter from him. An appeal was made to the Veep, and Lewis was upheld.

The report of the Vice President may contain more complete information.

To clarify the matter of credit, a member (other than a new member) has nine months in which to satisfy renewal credential requirements. This includes four mailings (e.g., for a November member, the February, May, August, and November mailings) and postmailings between those four mailings (e.g., for the November member, a postmailing after the February mailing and before the November mailing.) Material postmailed during the three months from the last month of your membership year to the first month of renewed membership is never counted as renewal credentials, for either the current or the next membership year. If anyone wants, I'll provide a fuller explanation (to include the history) by letter.

The Waiting List. Early in January the following communication was received from the Vice-President: "We are rid of the waiting list problem --- more than ten people have voted to blackball each waiting lister in the November roster. Accordingly, they are off the list, and ineligible to re-apply for a year." In a later letter, the veep stated, "Yes, the 12 people who have voted to blackball everyone listed every name (mimeographed, for the most part, but listed nonetheless)." Quotation of a few constitutional provisions is in order: Sect 9.2: "The Vice-President shall distribute, with the annual egoboo poll, and as a part thereof, an official form on which the members may list names of waiting-listers to whom they object. The Vice-President informs the Secretary-treasurer of the results of this portion of the poll.... Any waiting-lister objected to by ten or more of the voters in this poll is dropped from the waiting-list and may not apply again for admission for one year." Sect 6.13: "The Secretary-treasurer. He receives membership applications..." Sect 6.4: "In the absence of a formal controversy, each officer may decide for himself dubious points concerning his duties." Sect 2.3: "... The Secretary-treasurer shall determine whether the credentials ((of applicants)) are valid; if so, he shall admit the person to FAPA membership on payment of dues. If there is no vacancy and the credentials are valid, the applicant shall be admitted to a waiting list as of the date his application is received by the Secretarytreasurer. The waiting list shall be maintained by the Secretarytreasurer..."

Constitutional intent is clear in one area--admission to membership in order of application. The intent of the blackball provision is equally clear to at least those members of FAPA who were around when it came into being--a possibility for screening from applicants those who were either dangerous to the freedom of expression practised in FAPA, or those who were a complete drag on the membership.

Upon receipt of the current blackball results, I had received and noted three applications for membership, and had added them to the end of the waiting list: Seidman, Gilbert, and McInerney. The blackball of the entire waiting list, as listed in the November FA, however, made it clear that the intent of the twelve voters was to eliminate the entire waiting list, not merely those whom they knew about. Accordingly, I closed out the complete waiting list, within my responsibility of maintaining the

waiting list and my duty of determining for myself doubtful points about my duties. For a few moments, it seemed like 1948 or so again, when Laney and others had been wondering how to maintain a full FAPA rester. They had scouted up interesting fans, with some interest in FAPA, and almost forced them into FAPA. It seemed like a reasonable approach to the problem of no waiting list, so I used it. I have taken a group of fans whom I believe to be reasonbly interesting, and interested in FAPA, and have created a list of petential members for whom there is no other name than "the waiting list." To the end of the list I've added applicants who requested FAPA membership after the time I created the new waiting list. Some of these people were on the prior waiting list, but I see no difficulty in this since they did not reapply for membership. My time being limited, I haven't queried each individual about his interest in FAPA at this time, but I feel confident that my choices have been reasonably competent, and if I've erred, the individual can either request to be dropped, or he can be eliminated by either a "special rule," or during next year's blackball opportunity.

My apologies for the long preamble, but radical change needs explanation. Herewith, then, the new waiting list:

The \$1 admission fee formerly charged is discontinued, and will be refunded to members of the waiting list from 56 on.
