Fandom in general, and FAPA in particular, was hit hard in the first quarter of this year by death and by disaster. It is easy to say--and, of course, quite true--that Ron, Lee, and Dale Hart (who was one of FAPA's better poets some years ago) would not have wanted us to dwell unhappily on their passing, and that Bob and his family were fortunate that the fire harmed only their possessions and not them. However, the tragic loss of three good friends will be felt by many of us for a long, long time--no matter how cheerful our approach to the present and to the future may be.

And, Bob, if there is anything that FAPA as an organization, or that each of us as individuals, can do to help replace items that were destroyed, please let us know.

In this issue of THE FANTASY AMATEUR you will find a proposed amendment of Section 4 of the FAPA Constitution. Based on Bill's February Secretary-Treasurer's report we believe that the dues must be raised. In fact--as Bill pointed out--it may very well be necessary to assess the membership this year--to get us over the hump prior to the raise in dues. We ask that all of you vote in favor of the amendment, and we hope that there will be no griping or petty protesting if, in the meantime, an assessment proves to be necessary.

Remember that for a while there we were paying less dues than required by Section 4.1, and--the precedent having been established--that this could happen again in the future, once the treasury is more than healthy again.

We could have called for a special vote but we dislike the panic button approach. The Constitution provides for assessments without the need of a special balloting, and our Secretary-Treasurer is a good man who will know whether or not an assessment is necessary. And this gives us the economical benefit of voting on the raise in dues at regular election time rather than paying the extra postage, etc, for a special vote.

(The Secretary-Treasurer can call for the assessment in the pages of THE FANTASY AMATEUR; requires less rigmarole than a special vote, with no additional expense to the treasury.)

So stand by to be asked to pony up (4.2)--and help keep FAPA green (& not in the red) by voting Yes on the proposed raise in dues come election time.

The Secretary-Treasurer's Report

Membership

As of 6 May the following is the status of the FAPA membership. Renewal dues are \$3.00/year for North American memberships, \$2.00 for overseas. Symbols used in the following roster are:

- D - dues are due on or before 10 August
- \$ - dues are due on or before 11 May, and have not yet been received. If not in before you read this, you are out, unless you invoke Sect. 3.3, 3.5, or 9.1.
- A - the number of standard pages indicated following the renewal month must be published before or in the next mailing to make you eligible to renew. Material in this mailing has not yet been credited, of course.
- ATM - activity as indicated was due in this mailing, or postmailed before the mailing date, 11 May.
- ANov - as a new member, Sect 2.4 requires that you have your first year's renewal credits of 8 pages published in or before the 3rd mailing, or your membership if cancelled, and you do not get the third mailing - the one indicated.
- [1] - funds on deposit. I have deducted, where enough was on deposit, for May renewals, but not for August.

This doesn't look too bad. However, I've been doing a little checking. Of that balance, over \$55 is funds on deposit, and hence subject to refund if not used. I've also checked the last 7 mailings; the average cost of a mailing has been \$62. This comes to \$248/yr; dues at present come to \$195. Even allowing for a few waiting list additions, this still has a deficit of about \$50, not allowing for any other expenses. If this mailing is average, we will end up with a real balance of about \$33, plus the dues. August is the big renewal month, but even so, we would come out of the August mailing with a balance insufficient to cover the November mailing. This will be true even if the dues increase passes. It takes time to build up with a dues increase. So, to avoid scraping the bottom of the barrel, or of having to make a special notice mailing, or such expensive item, I'm going to invoke 4.2 and assess all members \$1.00 for the August mailing. This must be paid to receive the August bundle. If not paid to me by the deadline for the mailing, the bundle will not be mailed, nor will an FA. Note that if you have a D after your name, you will have to send in \$4.00 to renew and get the mailing. If you have enough for the assessment on deposit, I will deduct this. This means that Derman, Dreen, Caughran, Clarke, Deckinger, Demmon, DeVore, Hansen, Lyons, Martinez, Metcalf, Moffatt, Patten, Perdue, Scithers, Silverberg, Speer, Tapscott, Wells, Wesson - all have at least \$1 on deposit and hence will get the bundle automatically. However, several of them do not have enough for both the assessment and dues. Check your listing carefully.

To repeat - An assessment of \$1.00 is made for the August mailing. This must be paid to receive the August mailing, and no later than 6 months after the mailing date. To get the bundle at the regular time, the \$1 should be sent to me, not the OE, before the next mailing deadline.

If the dues aren't raised, I see similar assessments about once a year.
