The annual election ballots are included with this mailing. Yes, it is another case of volunteers not having opposition. But all candidates do have a track record. Russ has been VP before and turned out a Poll result promptly each time.

#### Mailing hints:

- Any mail sent via the postal service (including USPS express mail) should go to the PO Box. (To clarify a bit, all zines to the OE's (Seth's) PO Box (Concord) and all dues and address changes to Sec-Treas's (Robert's) PO Box (Glen Ellen)).
- If you send Express Mail or other mail requiring a signature, waive the signature requirement. On Express Mail you will find this box in the right hand side above the destination address. This speeds delivery. I have a large PO Box so there is no problem depositing packages in it.
- Use my street address for mail that requires one (such as FedEx). Mail methods that do involve a signature can cause a delay as I do have to then leave a note for the next day's dropoff. Again I recommend you to sign a waiver if possible. UPS has been willing to just leave packages at my door and the neighborhood is a safe one. I also have

paperwork filed with Federal Express to leave packages by the door.

Once again I remind people to please send at least 68 copies and preferably a couple more to make the collators' life easier. The surplus stock does get used, both in sales to increase the treasury and to replace lost or destroyed mailings. Please remember that the Sec.-Treas. can not count for renewal credentials any zine that sent 65 instead of 68 copies.

The surplus stock sale continues. Cost for old mailings is \$4 each complete mailing plus \$2.50 (\$3.50 for nonUSA addresses) postage for the first one and \$1.50 (\$2.00 for nonUSA addresses) for each beyond that. Preference will be given to waitlisters. The most recent mailing will always not be available so that those bundles can remain for their primary use, replacement for copies lost in the mail. Currently available mailings are 216 (3 copies), 222 (1 copy), 223 (3 copies), 225 (1 copy), 226 (1 copy), 227 (1 copy), 228 (2 copies), 229 (3 copies), 230 (3 copies), and 231 (2 copies).

NEW Dues Rate for 1995: \$15 PER YEAR

### 1. The Membership Roster

This report is correct up to August 8, 1995. In the listings below, the month following your name and address is that in which your present membership expires; the number following that indicates how many  $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$  inch pages (or equivalent) you must publish in, or prior to, that mailing to qualify to renew your membership. Credit has not been given for items in this August mailing or for any postmailings to the May mailing which have not yet reached me, as well as for dues received between now and the deadline.

Abbreviations indicating your membership status are also used in the roster below, as follows:

- #.... Change of address since the last mailing. *Please note:* It is your responsibility to inform me of a change of address; don't count on me to notice it in your FAPAzine. (Waiting list members should also keep me advised.)
- D..... Dues are due now and *must* be paid by next mailing's deadline, November 11, 1995. The dues rate for 1995 is \$15. Make payment payable to Robert Lichtman, not to FAPA, and send to him at address in roster below.
- \$ ..... Dues are overdue; if not received by the deadline, you must petition for an extension to retain membership.
- A .... Activity to bring your total up to 8 pages must be in this mailing or the next, or postmailed before next mailing.
- ATM . . Activity must be in this current mailing or in a postmailing sent out before August 12, 1995, or you are ineligible to renew; however, you may petition for an extension of time. (See FAPA constitution.)

ANov etc. For first year members only, the mailing indicated is the one by which you must publish your 8 pages for renewal so as to receive that mailing and retain your membership.

A dollar amount noted in brackets below represents the amount of funds that member has on deposit for such things as faster postage, prepayment of dues, etc. If you owe dues and have a credit balance, the amount you need to send is in small print to the right of your listing.
