ADDENDA 'TO VEEP'S REPORT: Apparently Ed Martin has circulated copies of a letter which the secretary wrote him denying credit for material in the last mailing, and thus cancelling his membership. Added to this are certain comments which demand that official notice be taken.

In the official letter, the secretary disallowed credit for mat-erial as not satisfying section 5.54 (represent to a substantial ex-tent the work of the member) or 3.1 (reprints do not count). He also pointed out the two methods of retaining membership: Sect 3.3 (22 petitions) or 12 petitions). In addition, although not stated, the constitution provides that the vice-president decides in questions of interpretation of the constitution-which is certainly involved here.

Until I received this item from Martin, I had heard nothing from him; I can only assume he did not feel certain enough of his position to attempt to obtain either 22 or 12 signers, or to ask me for a ruling.

I am not certain how I would have ruled had the question arisen. I am inserting this addendum to my report merely to indicate that Martin did not exhaust the remedies available to him. And to point out that comments-on-comments are definitely satisfactory under 5.54, that I am not yet a resident of Southern California - nor is our President, at last report - and certainly not a member of the "inner clique" - whoever they may be. Leslie Norris, maybe?

## THE VICE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

1. The Egoboo Poll. Attached somewhere in the FA will be two copies of the official form for registering your approval of the various items in last year's four mailings, and thus increasing the stock of various members egoboo. There are several differences this year. First, I have gone over to the total points in a category voting. A certain number of points are set, and may be distributed as desired, up to the maximum per person shown. No fractional votes, please. One class has been eliminated, as being a little hazy - editor. Instead, the fanzine category has been split into two one-shots and "regular" magazines. The latter are those which had at least two issues last year in the mailings. [Or follow a multi-yearly frequency, and appear on schedule.] In these two categories, the vote is for specific titles - points will be added to the publisher's total, or split if there is a multiple editorship.

Please indicate which Busby or Trimble or Coulson or White, etc., you are voting for. And vote for material in last year's mailings. Not this mailing. [I hope that Dan McPhail. will have the round-up in this mailing's Phantasy Press.]

There is also the section for most disliked waiting-listers. No points given here.

If you want your ballot back, say so on it; otherwise, I will use them to celebrate May 1 with a bonfire. <u>Deadline: April 25</u>. [But don't delay]. I almost forgot. This year, married (joint) memberships get two copies to avoid fights.

## VOTE!

2. "Leslie Norris." By now, I am sure all of you know that "Leslie Norris" does not exist as such. The question of whether Ted Johnstone, who has been admittedly at least a part of the Leslie Norris (IN) hoax, can take over his place on the waiting list has been referred to me for decision on an appeal from the decision of the former secretary [who hap ened to be me] that he could not, a decision based upon the assertation that Norris was the work of a syndicate, and thus not a real person.

To clear the murky waters somewhat, I intend to give a brief resume of the case. Last March, two complaints were made to me by FAPAns that IN was a pseudonym for Ted Johnstone. I wrote Johnstone about this, questioning his occupying two places on the wl. He replied that as soon as IN was in, he intended to drop the name and auume the Johnstone one. At the same time, the second place on the wl would be vacated. I agreed to this, as there is a ruling allowing pseudonyms in FAPA. This is the letter Pelz quotes in the last issue of Ankus.

Then, in July, Donaho wrote, protesting that LN was a corporate entity, being sustained by material contributed by Johnstone, Pelz, and Rich Brown. This indicated a much different situation, as the consitituion specifically provide s that members be "individuals" and makes the specific exception for married couples, who can have a joint membership. So, on Aug 6 I wrote Johnstone; the pertinent parts are as follows:

"When the Norris name was placed on the wl, it was a creation of Pelz and Brown; you were not involved at that time. Thus, letting you use it to vault some 22 places on the wl would be unfain and illegal....

"....As various evidence indicates that the work of Norris was done by several individuals, he obviously does not qualify under this person requirement. [See above.]

"The question of who is responsible for the material used for credentials, if any individual is to become Norris in FAPA, has been raised. That is, are the credentials actually the work of the person entering FAPA. "The Brandon case has been cited as a decision allowing such corporate membe rships. However, as acon as this was known to be a hoax, action was started to correct the situation....

"Some statements made by various SAPS members indicate that at least part of the Norris credit/responsibility is still being taken by Pelz. This confirms the statements regarding collective action made above.

"In view of the above, I am removing the name of IN from the FAPA waiting list as of this mailing. If you should decited to protest this action, complaints should be directed to the vice-president, Dick Eney, for decision as to the interpretation of the constitution."

I heard nothing from this before I left on vacation; so far as I know, Dick mey heard nothing. Ted, Bruce, etc, mentioned nothing about this at the Seacon. So, I assumed all was well, and that Johnstone had accepted the inevitable.

Then, when I returned to DC, I found a card from Johnstone complaining that he had been dropped and wondering why. I mentioned the Aug 6 letter; Ted replied that the letter of Aug 6 was "not available for reference here." [I still don't know what he means by that.] Johnstone also stated that IN had been created by Rich Brown and himself; that after Brown went in the Air Force, Johnstone did it all. He had written the IN SAPSzines, the one non-apa Fantoccini, etc.

Various correspondence with Johnstone, Trimbles, Donaho, Lichtman, Pelz, and Brown finally brought forth the following information:

Johnstone apparently put the Norris name on the wl at a time when he could have put the Johnstone name on instead. The intention was to use the IN pseudonym for the FAPA activity of Johnstone.

Johnstone has done most of the IN material; the amount of authentic IN material done by others has been almost nil in recent years.

Johnstone has apparently done all the LN leter-writing and other nonzine work, except for the tape recording of LN.

Johnstone has written 90% of the IN material while IN has been on the FAPA waiting list. The credentials cited for IN would be and are valid for Johnstone.

Johnstone put his name on the FAPA waiting list only when its omission would look strange.

It seems that the statements regarding Pelz as IN are in error; Pelz disclaims all connection. If this point is disproved, then the matter is open for reconsideration.

Therefore, Johnstone gets the IN position on the wl.

As a warning to future multiple-personality hoaxes, I might warn that the burden of proof that the "individual" is actually an individual, and not a corporate entity, will fall upon the person trying to use it to obtain membership. The s-t, as soon as he learns of such a case, shall drop them (it) from the wl, ar membership, with details of charges in both letters to the persons concerned and in the FA. Appeals will then be to the vp, together with any supporting evidence.
