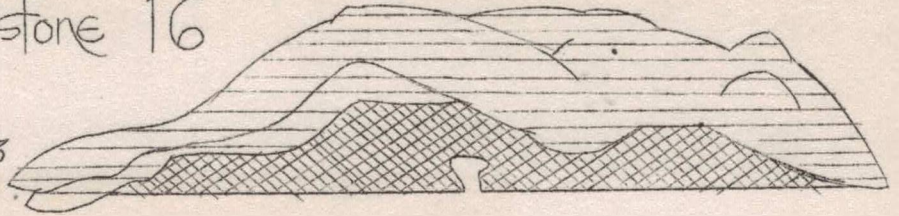


The Gallant Gallstone 16
