UNDERSTANDING YOUR MAILING LABEL

Besides the basic address-lines, there are two code-marks; one alphabetic and the other numeric. The A ,C or E indicates why you are getting this issue. A=active member, C=contributor, E=Extended. (If none of these appears, you may assume Editorial Whim). The numeric code is YY/MM for your expiration date. If YY/MM falls between 30 days before and 60 days after the postmark date on this issue, you need to renew NOW to be sure of getting the next issue. If your alphabetic code is E, you have credit for contributions of material and are getting one issue beyond your membership-expiration date for each issue you had contribs in.

Foundation membership remains \$15 per year.

YES, IT DOES LOOK A BIT DIFFERENT

Issue #23 was the first issue of Harpings to be printed-out on our DeskJet Plus printer. Among its other useful features is the ability to print on 14" cut sheets, which makes for much neater and faster paste-up once the issue is composed. It can also handle fancy type-faces and graphics such as can be generated by a desktop publishing software package. We have acquired one of those, too. The end-intent is another issue (or several) of Kantelesometime real soon.

REVIEW: FILKINDEX *REVISED EDITION VOL. 1

Lastish I quoted a letter from Roberta indincating that this was about ready for publication. She sent me a review copy, and it looks promising.

I am not going to attempt an item-by-item comparison with the first edition, done by Sourdough Jackson (at least partly because I can't readily lay hands on my copy of that edition), but this version is at least as interesting for what got left out as for what got covered.

Roberta has completely rewritten the introduction, organizing it according to several commonly-asked questions about filk, e.g.: "What is Filk?" and "Where Can I Hear Filk?"

Under that first question Rogow includes a "filk categories" list which I bounced-off the APA-Filk folks a year or so ago, but omits the final category which I had hypothesized.

Following the introduction is a list of publications covered. This is where the omissions get really interesting. For instance, contents of John Boardman's apazine Anakreon are covered, but apparently not any other zines from APA-Filk. Dragons, Cows, & Kudzu by Suzette Elgin and Randy Farran is included, but none of their other books. Another omission, this one more frustrating, is the issue-numbers of serial publications. (This info is given with the song listing, but it would be useful to indicate the range of issues covered here in the index, also.)

The songs covered are sorted twice: by title and by author. Each section is alphabetized. In the TITLES section, the format is

In the AUTHORS section, song-titles and what book(s) they appear in are alphabetized below the authors' names. I find this section easier to search quickly than the TITLES section, but you do have to already know who wrote the lyric you are researching.

Clearly a *Volume 1-A* is indicated, to cover material printed before March, 1990 but skipped by this index. I am going to include some sort of copy of the list of

publications-covered with this issue of Harpings. Most of the publishers are already on my mailing list, and the ones who were not before now, will be after this. Y'all might want to contact Carol and Roberta with information about the missing publications and encouragement toward swift publication of the update volume. The address is
