## Minutes of the Meeting of 24 March

The meeting was called to order at 1:30 pm at the Boskone, ARLewis, in his cap of power presiding. The minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as printed in the last Instant Message.

As the Treasurer and committees' chairman were not present, their reports were postponed until such time as they might be present.

Copies of the Hugo nomination form were distributed and all were encouraged to support the Worldcon by becoming at least supporting members and to nominate for the Hugos in the classes they had knowledge of. Nomination rules were explicated: who can nominate, what is eligible in each class.

Bob Toomey is starting up an Western Mass. SF group (again, there was an active club there in the past). Any one interested in the Springfield area should get in touch with him.

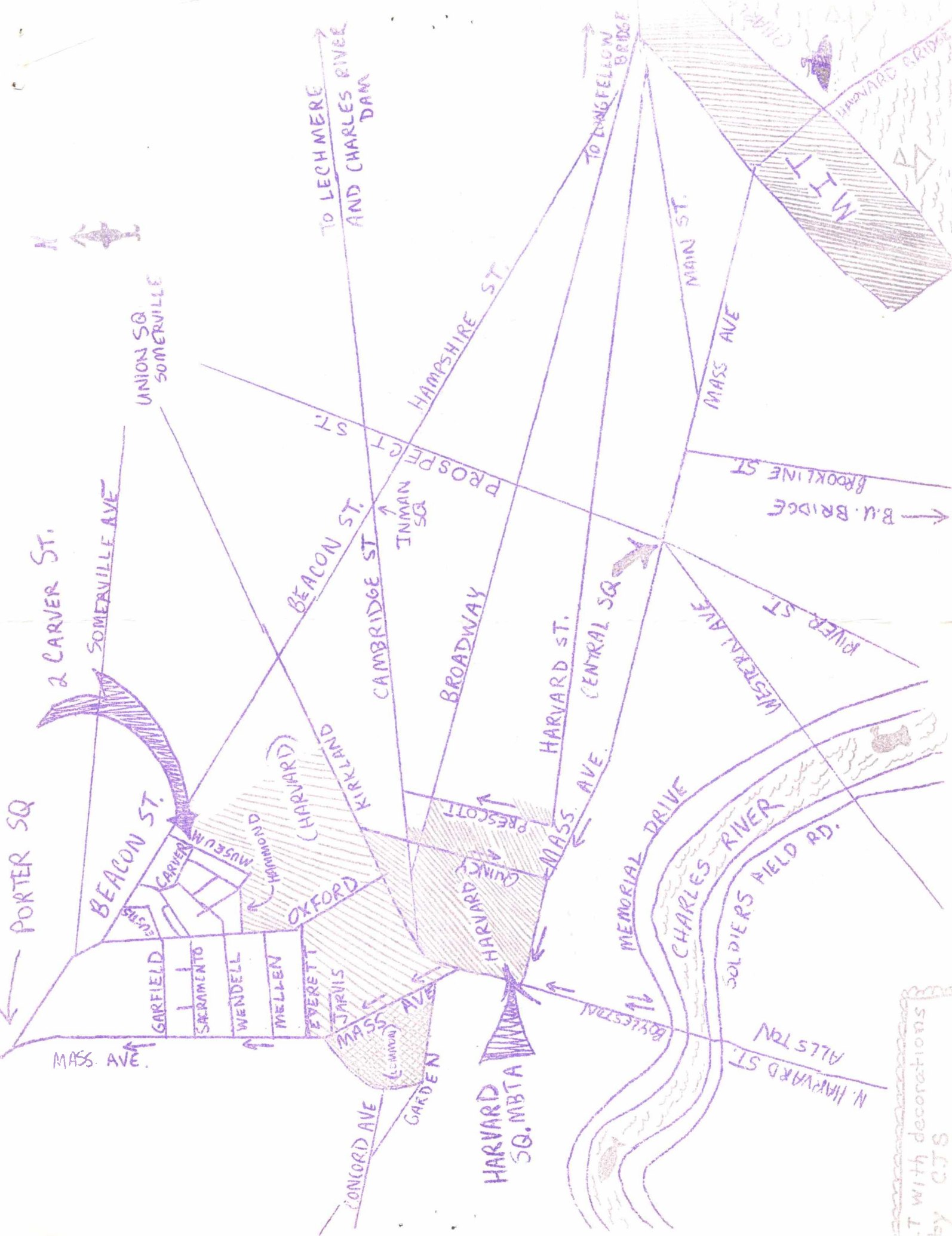
