SICKNESS--(Harness) This is extremely funny satire, more of which I wish you'd put through APA L.

DEGLER--(Porter) You can't get around the fact that a good many FAPAns say the same things every quarter and that there's a lot of godawful crud in the thing. There are several FAPAzines of excellent quality, but many zines which might be interesting after reading them once or twice become boring over a period of time. I didn't used to feel this way, but after reading all the mailings for the past 2 years or so I've become progressively less interested in FAPA. Are you judging the mailings from excerpted parts sent you as a wler or have you also plowed through them all?

L--(White) Yes, LA does have a Pacifica station, KPFK. Although it is more entertaining than the others, it doesn't match WBAI's programming. KPFK has extremely fine programming Sunday and Saturday evenings, but during the week it usually plays classical music.

People comment on cruddy apazines to fill their own cruddy apazines, but a cruddy genzine is ignored and soon folds because the editor isn't getting enough egoboo from it.

ROQUAT -- (Berman) Yes, that's the Mikado Fred and I saw. I find that I agree completely with your appraisal of it. It isn't often that you find an exceptionally well played Mikado. Of course, Ko-Ko is much harder to play well, but this one was mediocre. I also objected to their cutting the second verses out of everything as well as cutting out the trio and madrigal entirely.
