

### Secretary's Report:

After a good deal of soul-searching and arguing, future screenings of the film group are to be the responsibility of the seretary alone with a final OK to be given by the club committee. This arrangement should produce a better array of films than what has been shown previously.

Our next four screenings are as follows:

16th August

Feature film: "FAIL-SAFE"; based on the best selling novel of the same name is a Columbia film and stars Henry Fonda. As an added attraction we will be screening the first three episodes of a WHIZ! POW! BANG! serial, "King of The Rocket Men" which will take the place of our usual State Film Centre shorts.

20th September Feature film: "CASINO ROYALE"; in Cinemascope and colour with a great array of talent that includes Peter Sellers,

Woddy Allen, David Niven, Ursula Vndress, Andress, Joanna Petit. George Raft, William Holden and a cast of thousands.

Together with a further three episodes of our great serial.

18th October

"DR. GOLDFOOT AND THE BIKINI MACHINE" with Feature film: Vincent Price as a mad, mad scientist who tries to corner the worlds finance by marrying off his lovely feminine android robots to the worlds richest men. Another three episodes of the serial will be shown.

15th November Feature film: "THE PROFESSIONALS" with Burt Lancaster. Lee Marvin, Claudia Cardinale, Jack Palance in a rip-roaring adventure/comedy. A film that I recommend very highly. And....we finish our great serial, so don't miss this screening.

I hope to be able to announce the introduction of special 35mm screenings for club members soon. Negotiations are under way for the hiring of films from the distributors while I have already managed to secure a theatre siutable for our needs. However, in order to make sure that the film group does not take a loss, it has been necessary to make the following arrangements:

(1) That there must be pre-booking of seats in order for us to decide if there is enough interest to make the showing worthwhile.

(2) There will be a rise in cost to 1.00 per seat to pay expenses.

(3) If we do not receive pre-booking of at least forty seats, the screening will be cancelled.

As yet I can't promise what films will make up the screening, but I can can promise that they will be unavailable on 16mm and not very generaly shown. I know that Universal have prints of several of their early "Frankenstein" films as well as others of great interest....but, whatever I eventually decide on will be of interest to all.

One word of warning; we have here a chance to lift our film group up out of its present rut but if there is not sufficent response to the first 35mm theatre screening, I will have a hard time trying to justify a second screening, to the committee. It is up to us all to make this a sucess.

If you have any suggestions or iticisms, let me know. There have been suggestions that we should fix the sound system in the club, and this is now being done so we hope to have it ready for the August screening.

# M. S. F. C. CONSTITUTION

A special meeting of the Club will be held on Wednesday 7th August to discuss and, if possible, to approve a written Constitution. The new Committee was directed to draft a Constitution for the Club to think about and vote on, and it has worked out the following clauses as a guide to the kind of document it considers the Club should have. It is emphasized that this is a draft only: the final shape of the Constitution will be decided by those members who attend the meeting on 7th August.

It is also pointed out that only financial members of the Club will be entitled to vote at this meeting. (Check your status on the back page of this issue.)

- The name of the club shall be MELBOURNE SCIENCE FICTION CLUB.
- 2 Meetings shall be held at 19 Somerset Place, Melbourne, every Wednesday night, commencing at 8pm, except when Christmas and New Year holidays fall on a Wednesday.
- Additional or alternative meetings may be held when and where deemed necessary by the Committee.
- An Annual General meeting shall be held during the month of July, at which meeting an election shall be conducted to provide a Committee for the following year. Notice of this meeting shall be given to every member of the Club no less than fourteen days before the meeting is to be held.
- For the purposes of an Annual or any other General Meeting, twenty-five percent of the Club's current paid-up membership shall be deemed a Quorum.
- The Committee shall consist of seven persons, and shall include a President, Secretary, Treasurer, Librarian and Film Secretary. An Assistant Secretary may also be elected.
- The Club shall, at each Annual General Meeting, elect a Patron. The person invited to accept this position shall be a person of some eminence in the science fiction field, not normally resident in Australia. No duties shall be required of the Patron, but he or she may be invited to take part in some aspect of the Club's activities at the discretion of the Committee and with due regard to the desires of members.
- Meetings of the Club to consider amendments to the Constitution shall be held if so desired by the Committee or at the written request of ten paid-up members of the Club. The Secretary shall, within seven days, advise all members of this meeting and the business it is to consider; and the meeting shall be held no less than fourteen and no more than twenty-one days after it has been requested.
- Membership of the Club shall be available to any resident of Melbourne on payment of an annual fee of two dollars.
- Associate membership of the Club shall be available to any person normally resident outside the Melbourne metropolitan area on payment of an annual fee of one dollar.
- Fellowship of the Club shall be available to twenty persons on payment of an annual fee of twenty-eight dollars each, of which twenty-six dollars may be paid in weekly instalments of fifty cents.
- Members and associate members shall contribute fifty cents to Club funds at each meeting attended. This contribution shall entitle the member to up to five books from the library and supper free of charge. Fellows of the Club shall enjoy these same privileges at no additional charge.
- Clause 12 notwithstanding, members who attend meetings for the sole purpose of exchanging books may elect only to pay a fee of five cents for each book borrowed. If any dispute shall arise as to the good faith of members attending meetings for this purpose, the decision in the matter shall rest with the Committee and shall be binding.
- Any member who borrows more than five books from the library shall pay a fee of five cents for each additional book.
- Any person may be requested to leave the Club's precincts who, in the opinion of the Committee members present, is inebriated, or is behaving in an offensive manner, or has attended three meetings consecutively without paying fees.
- The Club shall publish a monthly newsletter, to be called MELBOURNE SCIENCE FICTION CLUB NEWSLETTER, which shall be delivered or posted free of charge to all members of the Club. Copies may also be forwarded to other science fiction groups at the discretion of the Committee. An Editor shall be appointed by the Committee, and he shall be responsible solely for the production of such material as is supplied to him by the Committee and the delivery to the Secretary of the required number of copies.
- The Club shall conduct a Film Group which shall hold such meetings and charge such fees as shall be considered desirable by the Film Secretary, having due regard to the desires of members.

### TREASURERS REPORT

As you may or may not know, the club is not too well off financialy, but there are things underway to correct this state of affairs. There is however, a way in which you can help, and that is by checking as to whether you are a financial club member or otherwise. If you are not, in the interest of the continuation of the club and its improvement I would urge you to pay your membership, full or associate. Full membership of the club is \$2.00 per year and associate membership being \$1.00 which entitles you to receive the monthly newsletter and the right to use the library at any time when you are in Melbourne.

If you know of anyone who is interested in science fiction we would be pleased to see them along at the club as it is only with a larger membership that we are going to be able to improve the club.
