



THE GREATER TRUMPS

CHARLES WILLIAMS

The Greater Trumps by Charles Williams is here suggested as a book to be read personally and also for consideration in voting as the individual branches pick their topics.

A new edition of the book has recently been published by Bard Books/Avon in paperback at \$1.45. It contains a useful preface by William Lindsay Gresham on the nature of the Tarot cards. It is probable that most larger paperback bookstores might carry it.

It would seem that Williams was ahead of his time in his awareness of mystic symbols and motifs, particularly in this book which uses as a base the Tarot cards, since in just the last few years the interest in the Tarot cards has greatly increased. Here, as in several other of his books, Williams starts with an occult or numinous object(s): in Many Dimensions it is the magical Stone of Solomon, in Place of the Lion it is the Platonic Archtypes, in War in Heaven it is the Boly Grail, in Descent into Hell it is a succubus, in All Hallow's Eve it is an abortive form of spiritualism - uscromancy. Williams starts with these ancient motifs, he never is writing about these elements, but weaves them into his story in that strangely unique way all his own.

The Greater Trumps is in my opinion one of William's best. It deals with an attempt by a family of modern gypsies to steal the original deck of Tarot card which have fallen into the hands of an English family. The gypsies wish to unite the primal deck with a set of three dimensional dancing images that match the cards. By fusing the two long separated elements together, they hope to fathom the meaning of the Great Dance and the Universe. The idea of the Great Dance and the Universe.
