Let it be noted that I left out two items in describing the Spring 1902 move. Both Austria-Hungary and Russia attempted to move in a manner that would have left more than six units in a zone. In each case, however, the move consisted of one group of units commanded to move in to an already occupied sector, while the units in the "overloaded" sector were either ordered to hold or not ordered at all (which amounts to the same thing). Thus, the resolution of the difficulty is simply that the number of moving (or attacking) units necessary to end up with just six units in the "overloaded" zone have their orders changed to Stand or Hold (the former if on foreign soil & the latter if in its Homeland). The position resulting from the Spring 1902 moves is as follows:
