Everyone has read Edgar Rice Burroughs novels of mars, with its red color. In his books all are red; the trees, the bushes, the grass. Has anyone ever tried to grow a garden with all red leaved-and-flowered plants, bushes and trees? I was surprised how many red-leaved plants there are when I went to a nursery. The same thing could be done in yellow.

I found a letter from Dorothy Smith on foods, etc of America....Many of the foods we enjoy today were first domesticated and introduced to us by American Indians, more than 80 plants, in fact. Among them are peanuts, squash, peppers, tomatoes, pumpkins, pineapples, many varieties of beans, corn, potatoes and other vegetables and fruits, including manioc and sweet potatoes. Corn and potatoes, together with rice and wheat, are the worlds most important staples today; yet almost half the crops that now go to make up the food supply of the world were unknown to the white man prior to 1492. (I could add tobacco, tho I cant consider that a blessing.) Our cotton, and the longfiber type of Egypt and Africa were developed from species cultivated by the American Indian. And the American Indians gave modern medicine many of the drugs we use today, cures used by Indian medicine men. Also, with psychiatric problems on the rise today, consideration is being given Indian cures for restoring mental health, as well as their methods for disciplining children. Our lives have also been influenced by the Indians through the use of pipes, parkas, canoes, snowshoes, moccasins, hammaks, kayaks, blanket and jewelry designs; even the rubber ball was adopted from the Indians. The lessons of Indian life helped inspire the Camp Fire Girls and the popular Boy Scout And Girl Scout movements. American Indians were aware from the beginning that, in order to preserve this land it was essential to live in harmony with nature. It has taken the white man generations to learn this truth...Secretary of the Interior, Stewart L Udall, wisely wrote, "It is ironical today the conservation movement finds itself turning back to the ancient Indian land ideas, to the Indian understanding that we are not outside of nature, but of it."

Bill James wrtes a little that might be helpful to anyone interested in horse and wagon camping...I think my interest in recreational vehicles was the result of an experience in the early 1930s, with a sheep camp in the Utah ranching country....The sheep camp was horsedrawn, had a canvass covering and contained two built-in bunks, a wood-burning stove, racks for rifles along with several crude cabinets for storage of staples...When it was not in use during the time the sheep were being pastured, it seved very nicely for shelter on hunting trips into the back country.

I have mentioned John Norman's series of adventure books on the counter-earth planet of Gor. In my opinion, the best of the series is Nomads of Gor. This is a nation of plains warriors who live in animal-drawn wagons with their herds; freely, bravely, and venturously. I know of at least two groups of people who are trying to live like that in animal-drawn wagons, out in the back country away from all people, towns, roads, industry, etc. One group is, or was, in the southwest around Texas. The other is, or was, in the mountainous foothills of the Utah country. It is amazing what enormous areas of America are almost completely deserted, being visited by nobody but, perhaps a few hunters or roundup crews, and they not once in five years or so, really abandoned lands, where you wont meet a single person in months.

I have 5 acres of land in Washington near Waukegan by the Klickitat River to trade for land nearer here or a 4 wheel drive pickup with a camper. I have a 90% complete custom designed/built, livaboard ocean sailboat, twinkeel, double end, freestanding pivoting mast, Thai rig, mahogany/plywood/fiberglass, builtin floatation, slopedeck... \$10,000 or trade for land, a house, smaller boat and money, or? I had many things designed in that I realized would be nice on my trip from Lake Erie to here in my old 18' sloop. I think it is the equal of either Blondie Haslers or Chichesters trans-ocean singlehanders. I also have a trade list of hundreds of things, free for a stamp. I'll trade my magazines for others on the same subjects or a stamp; The Smithy on welding, blacksmithing, farrier work.... Mendocino Husbandman on subsistence farming.... Pioneer on survival, health, woodcraft, opinions, etc.

I'm sure I have told all of you about my farm but I think I'll do it again. It is a fabulous place. I bought 20 acres on a county road and mail route. It is rather rough land, much of it up and down. It has streams and a fine place for a dam. I wonder why more dams, sky dams if necessary arent built. A small one, if stocked with fingerling sunnies and bass (the sunnies, a very pretty fish can be eaten but are mainly to be food for the bass who provide the main foodfish) should provide all the "meat" one family can eat in a year. The pond tends to itself, as do the fish. All the farmer need do is catch them. The pond could be fertilized yearly tho. It has some trees so big three people couldnt touch fingers around them. On one end is a 30' cascade-waterfall. The streams have some water all year.. The hillside about a hundred feet from the house-site is a pathway for wild turkey, mountain lion, bear, fox, stray bantam chickens and guineas and wildcats. Bushbunnies and roadrunners patrol the roads. Stray cows and horses wander the bottoms. Quail by the hundreds, hawks, eagles, woodpeckers etc live in the woods. The nearest neighbor, except for some friends living in little hidden cabins, is about 5 miles away. On foggy fall evenings the willows fly around over the meadow. These are some sort of glowing greenish ball of light things that move around in the dusk. The Indians say they have always been here and accept them very casually. The trees range from several varieties of pines and firs and oaks to mulberry, manzanita, maple, etc. This is an area where several different land types and floral areas touch together which accounts for the variety of plantlife. I find jade and jasper and other beautiful kinds of stones on the land. Many trees are draped in Spanish moss. The air and water are as pure as anyplace in the country today, and probably purer. No stray women unfortunately but maybe that can be remedied.
