


A MATTER OF INTEREST - R.W. Chambers. COSMOPOLITAN July-Aug. 1897.
Pt. 1, July 1897. The protagonist, walking around lonely Pine Inlet, surprises a young woman engaged in a similar business. She speaks of certain impressions her father is studying, and requests that he keep to the dunes, as the desired footprints are on the beach proper. He shortly learns that the young lady is the sister of one of his best friends, who takes him to her paleontologist father, before whom he succeeds in making a fool of himself, by pretending interest in fossils; however, Mr. Holroyd - for such is his name - detains him because of his exceptionally good eyesight. The next day he sees two interesting - but very disconnected - things: a papier-mache dinosaur and an elephant rifle; he is instructed to carry the latter and leave the former alone; moreover, he is enjoined to watch the ocean, carefully, day by day, for a Thermosaurus, which, it is explained, is a sort of amphibious reptile, extinct since the Cretaceous. However, Professor Holroyd has learned that there is one available at present, somewhere nearby. The bullets of his gun have streamers of palladium attached, so that in moving they string it out behind them. By this device they hope to anchor the Thermosaurus if it is dead, or both kill and anchor it if alive.

Pt. 2, Aug. 1897. The professor shows up and explains why the protagonist is expected to mount his vigil, as calculations show the creature to be approaching. Holroyd explains that no one must venture on the beach because of the presence of certain monstrous birds whose survival is associated with that of the sea-monster. As they are swimming in the surf a few days later they are attacked by one of those monsters, but escape to the boilers which Holroyd has caused to be set up along the beach as refuges. One of the laborers, Frisby, is attacked by one of the birds, but is saved by the hero, who wounds it and anchors it to a tree by means of the wires which are attached to his bullets. Returning to his post, he shoots and anchors the Thermosaurus, but is set upon by its escort of birds and barely escapes with his life; however, he loses consciousness because of his wounds at their hands. Waking, he learns that the Thermosaurus is safe but that all the birds, including his anchored and wounded victim, have escaped. He, of course, marries Miss Holroyd.

This is quite a nice story, and is recommended to almost anyone, but the professor has an amazing lack of basic knowledge of his field.

TUNNEL NUMBER SIX - Derby. BLACK CAT June 1897. Mysterious voices are heard in a tunnel of magnetic ore, and the theory is advanced that they are the voices of men in other mines somehow transmitted by some unspecified property of the ore. However, the miners are convinced they are ghosts and reject the very unlikely hypothesis advanced by the management. Pointless and not very interesting.


