

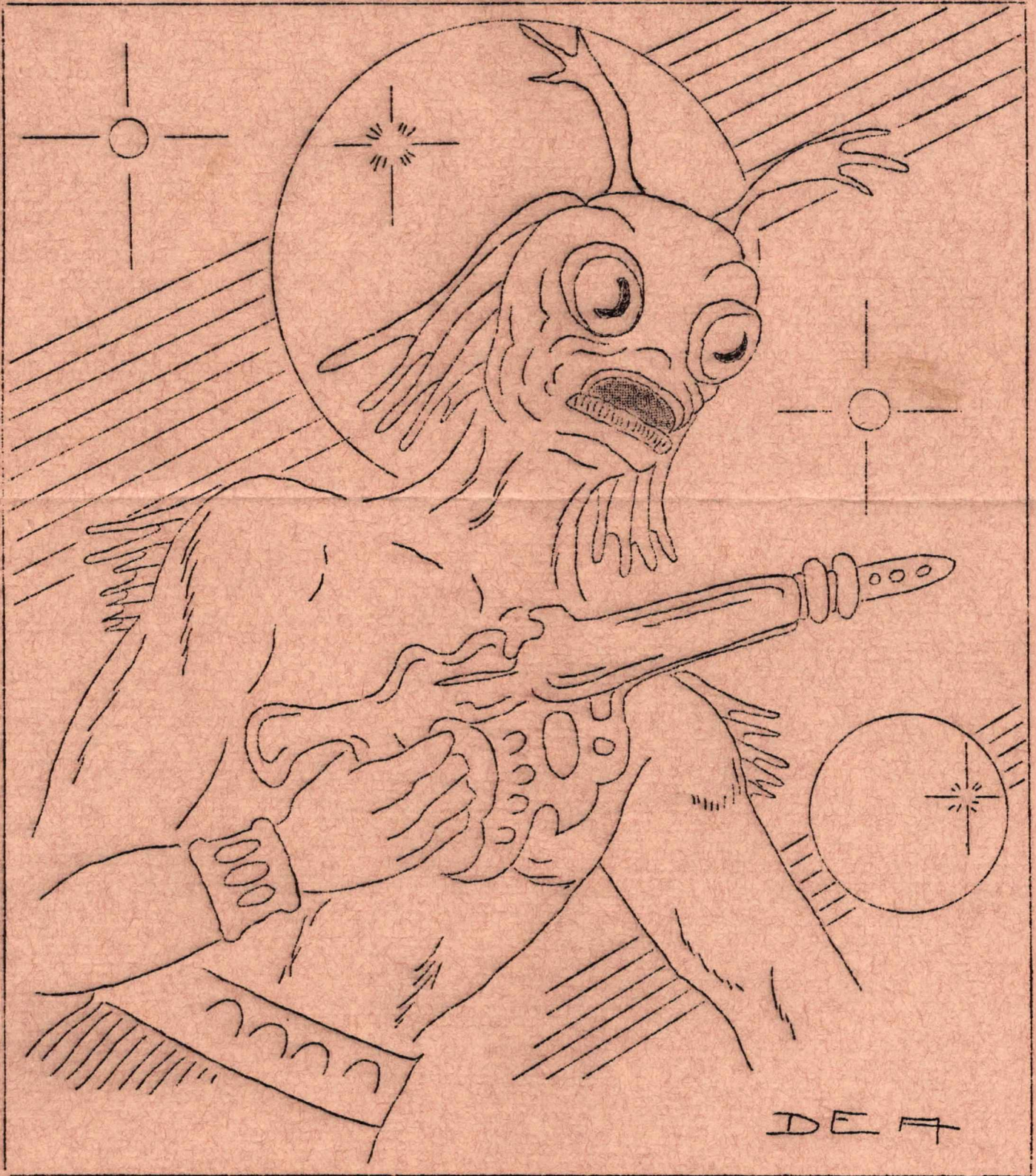

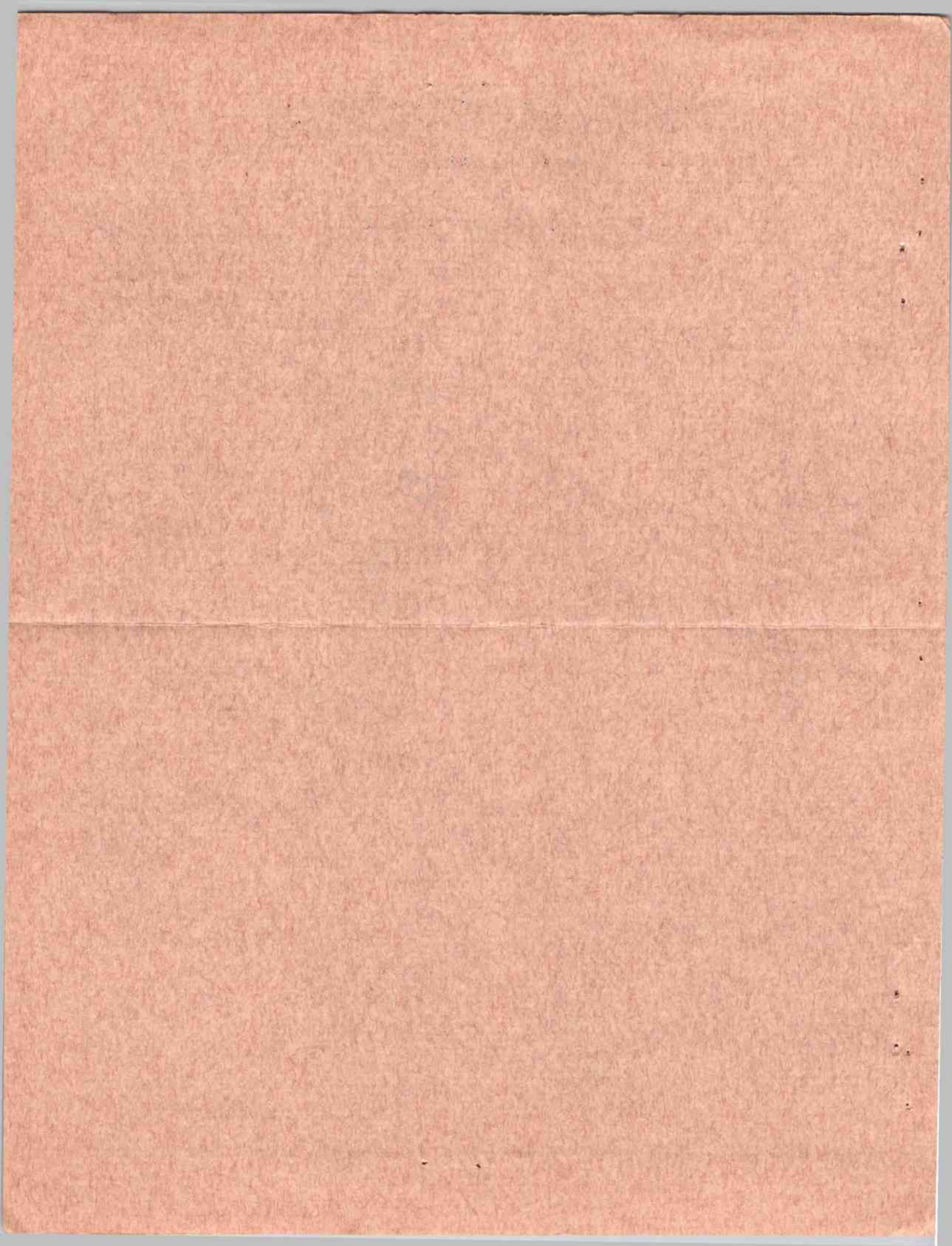

AMAZING! ASTOUNDING! Time Magazine July 10, 1939. This is a rather poor report on the first SF convention, but deserves, in my opinion preservation and at least an occasional note as the biggest bit of fan-don has yet gotten, in terms of the importance of the magazine.

Very well, here's what Dixon wants:

THE BRAIN BLIGHT - Jack Harrower, ALLIORY March 1913.
Frank Lawdale and Miriam Keenton are, as the story opens, planning on marriage, but old Dr. Keenton asks them to wait a while. In a few days, on a rainy night when Lawdale has been visiting the old gentleman, he sees two bandits enter by a window, he tells the nearby butler, but before that person could sound an alarm he was killed by a strange device in the hand of one of the pair, who have been looting files for papers. As one of the intruders is engaged, Lawdale attacks and stuns him, but the other draws a gun and forces him to surrender; they then await the doctor, to whom they address some very cryptical comments. After they have left, the doctor explains that they are attempting to force him to reveal some secret, and also explains that the whirling death that slew the butler is useless against him for several reasons, and that he also possesses it; and that by his observation of the butler's death Frank also has become a major factor in the game. Lawdale resolves to wait and see what can be done against his enemies. At this point the narrator brings us up to date on the puzzling 'brain blight' which had converted brilliant and successful men into feeble 'idiots', and was cured only by Keenton.

Valdez asks Lawdale to get Keenton to surrender this secret, and, to force the matter, kidnaps Miriam; Lawdale tries to kill them, but is prevented by a threat to Miriam's life. Valdez tries to kill Lawdale by the whirling death, but a well-placed revolver bullet dissipates the death so that it merely hurts him. When he returns to the Keenton place, he finds the doctor preparing a protection from the thing, and equipped with it they rescue Miriam; it shortly becomes evident that Valdez and the other criminal have some knowledge of the blight. Garson, the less human of the pair, tries a direct attack with an accomplice upon Keenton's safe, but a mechanical device stuns them. The butler awakes and escapes, and Lawdale lets Garson go. Lawdale joins forces with Estrada, whose father had been killed by Valdez. Lawdale also suspects that Keenton has some ulterior motive in his examinations of Forrester, a patient whose brain blight has progressed too far for cure, but knows little.

Garson, out hunting for Lawdale to kill him, is waylaid by one of Estrada's cutthroats, who kills the murderer but accidentally breaks his whirling-death container, releasing a monstrous disc of death, which slays him.

Meanwhile, there is a movement to force Keenton to reveal his cure for the blight; however, he states flatly that after his death Lawdale will publish the cure, and that anyhow he is going to stop the epidemic.

Lawdale goes to a consultation with Estrada, and arrives to find Valdez drugging him and preparing to murder him. However, the protagonist intervenes and saves his friend.

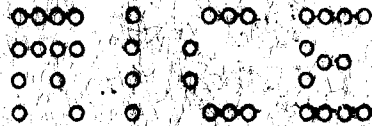
