BALLOT FOR 1938-1939 S.F.A. COUNCIL.

The Ballot for the seven members to constitute the next S.F.A. Council, is due to take place during next month. All members are asked to take special notice of paragraphs 2, 3, and 4, of the Association's 'Constitution', extracts from which are quoted below, and, if they so wish, act accordingly.

"Any member shall be eligible for election to the Council, and may be entered for ballot by the proposal of any member and the seconding endorsements of two other members, such proposals to be in the hands of the Executive Committee by the last day of October each year. Any member of the Council shall be allowed to stand for re-election at the conclusion of his Councilship, providing he makes written notice of his so desiring, such notice to be in the hands of the Executive Committee by the last day of October each year."

In due course, voting papers will be distributed, and the result of the ballot will be published in an organ of the Association. The new Council will commence office on January the 1st, 1939.
