Next mailing comes the September Mailing mentioned in the SFPA Constitution, and we all know what that means, don't we, boys and girls? That's right! There'll be a ballot in it. I haven't decided what form the annual Egoboo Poll will take, but it'll be different from the two I've already run—no sense in wearing out a pattern by using it twice. Also, the famous Split Infinitive Amendment will determine whether SFPA will sit still while grammatical gaffes run wild in the Constitution. But most important will be the OElection.

Thus far, three members have announced candidacy—that's Guy Lillian, George Inzer and Steve Hughes. Anyone else wishing to run may inform me of the fact by the deadline (Sept. 27), and his name will appear on the ballot. Say it in a note under separate cover from your zine (as a postcard), or I can't guarantee I'll see it in time.

Candidates for OE are reminded that smear campaigns directed against the incumbent are not only unseemly, but non-productive, since the incumbent has had all the shit he intends to take and is not running for a fourth term. (In fact, such tactics are probably not only non-productive, but counter-productive. If Steve's mailing comment to me this time influences any votes, it probably won't be in the direction he wants.)

So announce candidacy if you're of a mind to, and when the time comes, vote. This will be an important election, and I don't want it decided by a minority.

In accordance with the pattern set many mailings ago, maximum membership has been increased to 24 and the copy requirement to 29. Let me emphasize that. Send 29 copies for the next mailing and all mailings thereafter. When membership hits 24 on the nose, it will increase instantly and automatically to 25, and the Great Expansion will be complete.

You will find Gene Reed's name occupying the spot on the roster formerly occupied by Dwerd Gremlin—alphabetically as well as figuratively, since I didn't recall the change until I'd already typed the roster (the first thing I do on each OO). Next mailing, the name will appear in its proper alphabetical place. This is by request of Dwerd, tho why he'd want to be known by a silly name like "Gene Reed" is beyond me.

Gary Brown will be given a nice position in the Department of Redundancies Department for his zine Conglomeration #1. To him goes the singular honor of being the very first SFPAn to duplicate both title and number of another zine that has gone through the apa. Conglomeration was the title of a DeepSouthCon oneshot that lasted no less than two issues (1) spearheaded by Larry Montgomery. The first issue ran through the 13th Mailing and the second through the 17th.

Congratulations, Gary. You may be interested to know that the closest anyone else has come to your remarkable achievement was when Jerry Page put the first issue of his genzine, Phoenix, through the 26th Mailing, almost but not quite cuplicating Dave Locke's Phoenix #9, from the 13th Mailing.

All this groovy lore (name of another Jerry Page zine that went through SFPA, come to think of it), and much more besides, will be available when I finally publish my index to the first 50 SFPA mailings. I plan to start stencilling the middle and last section (and restencil the first, which won't fit the Rex and I don't want those black streaks down the sides) just as soon as Walter's (or Mishek's or whatever) delivers the ten quires I've had on order for two months. I'm not holding my breath.

One member has berated me vehemently for not allowing that Memphis State thing P.L. sent in the last mailing. See my mailing comment to The Southerner on the subject. I'd like to note here the observation that this same member, if I'd allowed the thing in, would have had an opportunity to accuse me of trying to hype the page count by including useless crud. My rulings won't please everybody, and I'm not going to try to make them.

--- RULES of The Southern Fandom Press Alliance--

- 1 Membership is limited to 24. Copy requirement is 29.
- Activity requirement is four pages of original (i.e., no distribution other than to contributors prior to the SFPA deadline) material in each pair of consecutive mailings. One page may be art by another person; the rest must be the member's own material. At least two pages must be the member's own writing.
- 3 Dues are \$1 per year, payable before the deadline of the mailing they are due.
- Initial activity for new members is four pages of creditable activity. Also, applicants for membership must pay one year's dues in advance. Waitlisters must acknowledge receipt of The Southemer. Missing twice in a row means you're off.
- 5 Ask your peevish OE about economical group memberships.
- 6 Owing activity is Frowned Upon. And what's more, missing mailings entirely will result in the member's being drawn and quartered in the manner described in The Southerner #53.
