RULES OF THE SPECTATOR AMATEUR PRESS SOCIETY

There are four mailings per year, mailed in early January, April, July, and October.

Dues are 35¢ per half year, payable in advance.

Each member must have at least four (4) letter sized pages in the mailings each half year. No pre, post, or special mailings shall be permitted.

The only officer is the Official Editor, who is elected annually and may succeed himself. He mails out the mailings, and publishes the Official organ quarterly.

Membership is limited to thirty. Members dropped for lack of activity go to the end of the waiting list, and, unless there are unusual circumstances, miss at least one mailing. Members dropped for dues may be reinstated, if a vacancy occurs, on payment of dues. He will receive any missed mailings, if they are available, if he pays up his back dues.

And that's all the rules there is room for.
