PILLAR POLL BALLOT for MAILINGS #55 thru #58

(Copies on russet paper, with text on back and staple holes, are Sample Ballots and not valid for voting. Copies enclosed with mailing, on white paper, are not listed as part of the mailing -- so even completists have no excuse for not voting.)

The Pillar Poll determines how each member, in the opinion of the other members, serves as a Pillar of SAPS (say I, cribbing from Busby's Pillar Poll Ballot). It is also the occasion for electing an.Official Editor for the following year.

Marking the ballot: There are a certain number of points to be distributed in each category, with a maximum number per person also indicated (heavier weightings are given the more important categories). Points must be awarded as whole numbers (no 1/2-points or any other fractions); all categories are to be read as "Best other than my own work -- no self-votes (or votes for the other half of your dual-membership) will be counted. You need not use all the total number of points in any category, but you might as well. If you go over the maximum total, only the first designations adding up to the maximum will be counted. If you award more than the individual maximum to anyone, the extra points will be lopped off.

Mail the marked ballot to Pillar Poll, c/o CRY, Box 92, 507 Third Avenue, Seattle 4, Washington, before 1 April 1962. Any and all of the Seattle SAPSites may be doing the poll-counting, so don't pay any attention to who's counting when you vote.

RULES

1. Membership: :limited to 36 persons. Married couples are considered one membership, but receive activity credit and voting privileges separately.

2. Activity: each member must contribute at least 6 quarto pages of original material in any period of two consecutive quarterly mailings, to be sent to the official Editor in an edition of at least 42 copies. (Careful, TCarr, you sent 41 this time, so I shorted your mailing.) Use of someone else's artwork may count up to one page of credit, use of your own up to three pages. The OE will be the only judge of whether a page is worth full credit. Postmailings are not credited.

3. Dues: \$2.00 per year, payable before the deadline of the last mailing of your current membership year. IMPORTANT: All members listed on the roster of SPECTATOR 57 who were still members as of 15 January are credited with a year's free dues, courtesy of our bulging treasury. New members who think they got slighted should stick

around and see how we do next year.

4. Waiting List: When no openings in the membership exist, applicants will be placed on a waiting list in order of application. Members of the WL must acknowledge receipt of the SPECTATOR within one month of the mailing, in order to retain their places on the list (time extensions granted to fans outside North America.) A fee of \$1 will be charged for admission to the Waiting List, payable to the OE within one month of the mailing. The fee is credited to the first year's dues as a member, but is not refundable to drop-outs. On being invited to join, a WLer must contribute the remaining dues and 6 pages minimum activity before the next mailing deadline. Declining an offered membership and returning to the bottom of the WL will result in a fifty-cent fine, deducted from the WL fee and not refunded.

5. Officers: The Official Editor makes all rules and transacts all business. All materials intended for a mailing must be in his hands by the 15th of January, April, July, or October. 42 identical mailings are assembled bor distribution to the members, and - on an availability basis - to the WLers. The charge for a mailing sent to a WLer is 25¢ per hundred pages (\$1 minimum). Any WLer wishing to circulate his

zine in the mailing may do so at a cost of 25ϕ per sheet (2pp). The OE is elected every year at the January mailing, and takes office after the April mailing.

The President of SAPS is a titular office granted the member placing highest in the annual Pillar Poll, a laureate poll based on mailings of the previous year, and also distributed with the January mailing.

All other members of SAPS are titular Vice-Presidents. An Emergency Officer is appointed to take over if the OE is unable to fulfill his duties, and other offi-

cers may be appointed by the OE at #### his discretion.

6. Immorality: It is immoral to miss a mailing. We're still loaded with immoral members this time: Larry Anderson, Dick Eney, Jane Gallion, Bruce Henstell, and Vic Ryan. Ted Johnstone is semi-immoral, as GIMBLE is in the mailing but had some prior distribution. It is also immoral to wait and get dropped instead of resigning and giving somebody an early chance at the spot. Coslet and Wanshel are both declared immoral on this ground. It is not immoral to argue with the OE, just foolhardy.
