RULES

- 1. MEMBERSHIP: Limited to 36 members. Married couples may be considered one membership and still receive activity credit and voting privileges separately.
- 2. ACTIVITY: Each member must contribute at least 6 quarto pages of his own original material in any period of 2 consecutive mailings, to be sent to the OE in an edition of at least 42 copies (43, to provide UCLA with a copy for their SF collection, would be appreciated). Anyone sending less than 42 copies will be fined one mailing's worth of dues, in addition to having to furnish the remainder of the required copies before credit is allowed. Reprints or priorly-distributed material does not count for credit. Your own artwork may count up to three pages of credit out of the 6, or someone else's art may count up to 1 page. The OE will be the only judge of whether a page is worth full credit. Postmailings will not be credited, under any circumstances.
- 3. <u>DUES</u>: \$2 per year, payable before the deadline of your current membership year, as indicated in the SPECTATOR.
- 4. WAITING LIST: When no openings exist in the membership, applicants will be placed on a waiting list in order of application. The waiting-listers must acknowledge receipt of the SPECTATOR, as evidence of continued interest in membership, within one month of the mailing, in order to retain their places on the list. Time extensions will be granted to overseas

WLers. A \$1 fee will be charged for admission to the WL, payable to the JE within one month of the time your name appears on the WL. This fee is applied to the first year's dues, but is not refundable to drop-outs. On being invited to join, a WLer must contribute the remaining dues and 6 pages minimum activity before the next mailing deadline. Declining an offered membership to return to the bottom of the WL will result in a 50¢ fine, deductable from the WL fee and not refundable.

5. OFFICERS: The Official Editor makes all the rules and conducts all the business. All materials for a mailing must be in his hands by the 15th of Jan, Apr, July, or Jct. 42 identical mailings are assembled for distribution to the members and -- on an availability basis -- to the WLers. The charge for a WL mailing is 25¢ per 100 pages or substantial portion thereof (\$1 minimum). The OE is elected each year at the January mailing, and takes office after the April mailing.

The President of SAPS is a titular office granted the member placing highest in the annual pillar poll, a laureate poll based on mailings of the previous year and circulated

with the January mailing.

All other members are titular Vice-Presidents. An Emergency Officer is appointed to take over if the OE is unable to fulfill his duties, and the DE may appoint other officers at whim.

- 6. IMMORALITY: It is immoral to miss a mailing. This time the following are therefore immoral: Breen, Brown, Johnstone, Kaye, Lewis, and both Rapps.
- 7. STUPIDITY: It is extremely stupid not to read all of the SPECTATOR.

NOTE WELL: Waiting-listers must acknowledge the SPECTATOR by 20 August, and by that same date Bergeron and Clarke must pay the \$1 fee. Blum has until 1 October to acknowledge. Our invitee must acknowledge by 20 August and get activity in by 15 October. Members must get dues and activity in by 15 October.
