There are some items which might have been in a tie vote position, if Joe had voted. If Joe replies that he did not receive the ballot, does anyone think we should vote again on any of the ited/s items which might have been put in a questionable position if he had voted? in other words, should a motion be put forth concerning this? Joe, did you receive the ballot " Now part of the problem involved here is my fault for not writing a WHAT, HEFFER sooner or for not contacting Joe sooner. Quite frankly I was wondering what I shoul do exactly and in my wondering, my mind wandered to other things. My fault, It Will NOT happen again, but I thought it would be best to if explain the situation. First I will give the balloting results.

The following were passed: #1, 3, 9, and 11 were passed by a two to one margin. #2, 4, 5, and 13 through 18, inclusive were unanimous.

Dues cover the period from January lat to December 31st, and less than a full year's dues may not be accepted by the Treasurer however, a new member jointfing after the first quarter of the year and submitting dues if for the following year may pay only that fift proportional part of the current year. Hembers have the right to vote in all elections and referendums and may participate in any benefits created by the organization.

MUTION #2: Put before the membership the following to vote ##/ on:

4. The President will submit to the incoming Directorate an actimated budget of funds required for the operation of the MPFF during the coming year. Said budget will be submitted to the Directorate no earlier than 15 December and no later than 31 December.

MOTION /11: Delete from the Bylaws, Article II, the President, Section 6, which reads: ( and remember other sections secondinaly)

6. The Promident is authorized to place a one-half page advertisement for the MTVT in a Progress Report of the World Convention, plus a full page advertisement of for the MTVT is the Gos Book. Payment will be automatic for these ads, not requiring a vote of the current Directorate.

HOTION #13: Add to the Bylaws, Article II, the President, the following (which may be remembered accordingly if any of the Hotions #6-13, inclusive, pass or do not pass):

9. At the instruction of the President, the Treasurer will send funds for estimated ink, paper, and postage depending on the currently-counted membership, and Af may also include estimated postage cost at rate the Constitution permits. Later a list of costs will be sent to the Treasurer to adjust payment f to fit the Addidial complete costs, up to the rate the Constitution permits.

MOTION #14: Add to the Bylaws, Article III, Section 1, that which is under Article III, Section 7, and delete Article III, Section 7, as such. Article III, Section 1, will then read:

1. The Chairmon of the Directorate shall report of to the nombership all measures passed by the Directorate. The Chairmon of the Directorate shall also keep a record of the Sylaws changed and update the Sylaws at least quarterly. The Chairmon shall also prepare a set of updated Sylaws of the Chairman's year of service and soud a dopy of these bylaws to the new chairman(or simply retain this updated version if the Chairman remains the same) and the new Chairman shifall send copies to the new members of the Directorate.

MOTION #15: A Moved that:

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The Mational Fantag Ff&f Fan Federation, in the spirit of fellowship and help to fans and fandom, shall denote to the Trans-Atlantic Fan Fund, a sum equal to 50 per member to be add to the non-committed funds of such fan fund.

MOTION #16: Moved that:

The sum of \$50.00 will be made available for Toroon Expenses, to be paid to Martha Beck, with an additional \$50.00 to be paid later if it is needed.

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MOTION #17: Moved that:

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A public Relations Committee be set up as soon as semmittee members are found. This committee will aid the verious Bureaus and specifically the Recruiting Bureau at this time. The committee will relate material concerning the N3F and its bureaus both internally, to those who are already numbers of the National Fantasy Fan Frederation, and externally, to those who might wish to join the National Fantasy Fan Federation and to create a "better image" of the National Fantasy Fan Federation.

## MOTION #18: Moved that:

The Treasurer will disburse upts \$15 to a person or persons designated by the Disoctorate, to purchase a "button" or identification, of sorts, for the manbers of the Mational Fantacy Fan Pederation, to identify them as such. If more buttoms are made their there are members, additional buttoms will be held by the Secretary and disbursed to new members. Buttoms may be distributed to these members wishing additional buttions at the original purchase cost of the button.

Obviously, the remaining notions ware not passed. If someone wishes to know what these were, please write me and I will send you a list of them.

On these motions requiring funding, planse notify the people involved, Janie. On others of questionallible nature in enseting, I will speak further in the course of this WHAT, MEYVER.

Some notes on Motion #2: Knymer writes: "I would like to propose that the Directors vote on the idea of a project that has been suggested by Don Francos -- That we publish a mine to be given out to interested fans at the TOROON this Fall. .... (This publication would help in getting morenembers into NFFF and also help to advertise our club to fame who attend the TORCON) Write to SFM STAN or DON if you used more info."
