"Dear IT Lindsay,

If Willis has asked me to say that he is disappointed with the terms of your letter of 11th ult. Apparently your society, which represents itself as makers of both Lampshades and Happy Fans, is unable to supply the latter in quantity within any reasonable period of time. ## Helen reviews the fourth OMPA mailing

Nigel has given me the task of reviewing the OMPA mailing this time and at the moment it is proving very difficult because owing to the Railway Strike it hasn't arrived yet. So here goes for the DOG SOAP formula: White soap...16 ozs Powdered Yellow Resin....4 ozs Tobacco Water.4 ozs Powdered White Hellebore..1 oz Lump Sugar...2ozs Carbolic Acid no.5 .....1 ozs Oil of Omganum....2 drams.

Pare the soap and place it with the resin, sugar and tobacco water in an earthen jar, and put in oven til liquified. Add the renaining ingredients. Stir well and pour into moulds holding about 3 ozs.


Do you know what can be done

NOW AND THEN In answer to your query, here is my recipe for freeted fligdilles with belchberry sauce:-

Perforate fligdilles with a fork (a swift stabbing motion should be used - do not prod). Mix sweet chutney, brown sugar, Worcester sauce, mustard, vinegar, salt & lemon juice and pour over the fligdilles. Allow to soak for 2 hours, then drain and freet. The secret of succesful freeting is to beat the fligdilles soundly with a rolling pin whilst they are frying. A little ointment added to the cooking fat will protect you from burns through splashing. For the sauce, take a well-ripened belchberry (a windfall is best), simmer for hour and strain through a jelly-bag. Repeat until the belchberry is quite limp, when it is of no further use and may be discarded. Thicken the remaining liquid by the Roux method and add a handful of pickled nasturtium seeds.

Serve immediately. (tested in the BIAS BINDING Kotchen Dept.)
