Copies of mailings 27 are available for \$1 and of 28 and 29 for \$1.50. I also have bundles of extra zines from mailings 9-28 at approximately 300pp. for \$1. Guaranteed to be all different zines.

OE ELECTION

Next mailing will be the OE election and I am definitely not going to run (Graduate School will not allow, I imagine). Any member is eligible to run for the post. To do so, he or she must file for the election by April 1, and will probably want to put some sort of platform in the next mailing. You might consider it. It won't be a difficult job, since I intend to reveal my secret method for being OE in my last mailing as one.

REMINDERS

Waitlisters, some of you seem to think that if you have something franked into the mailing for you, you are entitled to receive a free copy of that mailing. This is not the case. Nothing in the constitution could be interpreted to allow this, so you must pay for any mailing you want.

An important note for those wishing us to repro their zines: Please type your zines on Roneo stencils and type them within the proper margins for 8½" by 11" paper, that is, between lines 1 and 58 (you may, of course, leave wider top and bottom margins than this, if you wish), and please observe the side margins. Almost all the stencils we ran off this time for people did not conform to these margins, making things rather difficult for us. Also, you will be glad to know that repro cost will go down to \$2 per ream next mailing, due to decreased costs.

You may want to note the section in the constitution referring to special arrangements which can be made for members or waitlisters in the Armed Forces or jail. If you find yourself in such a situation, especially you waitlisters who I might not otherwise find out about, please let me know. I will be happy to make the special arrangements for anyone in either of these unfortunate situations. You might note that I would consider being busted for drugs "a crime of conscience" and will treat it as such with regards to these special arrangements (this is not meant to indicate that I believe any members or waitlisters will need such services in the near future, I sincerely hope they won't, but I did want you to be aware of it.)

APA-45 CONSTITUTION

I. Preamble

The Amateur Press Association of 1945, APA-45, is a society of amateurs working within the hobby of amateur journalism, which has grown up around science fiction fandom. Its purpose is to facilitate communication among its members by an exchange of fanzines.

II. Membership

1) Membership in APA-45 shall be not less than 20 or not more than 30. Upon assuming office, the OE shall declare the size of membership for his term of office. If this number is larger than the current number, new members will be added at the rate of one per mailing until the desired number is reached. If it is smaller than the current number, memberships will be eliminated as people are dropped from the organization. At no time will more than one membership per mailing be eliminated.

2) Membership in APA-45 is limited to persons born on or after January 1, 1945.

3) Application for membership, accompanied by the payment of one dollar to cover the first year's dues shall be sent to the Official Editor. The OE shall upon receipt, add the applicant's name, assuming that all requirements are met, to the membership roster. If the roster is full, the applicant's name shall be placed on a waitinglist; the one dollar paid by the applicant shall be considered a wl fee. This fee is non-refundable, but it may be applied to the first year's dues upon the applicants attainment of membership.

4) All waiting listers must acknowledge receipt of the Official Organ within six weeks after it is sent out. One failure to acknowledge drops the waitlister to the bottom of the waiting list; two failures to respond will result in his being dropped completely from the waiting list.

5) Couples may be considered as one membership if at least one partner meets age and other membership requirements. However, they may receive activity credit and voting privileges separately as long as each half of a dual membership meets page requirements.

III. Activity

1) To retain membership in APA-45, a member must contribute a minimum of 6 quarto pages of material of which 5 must be his own original work, every 6 months.

2) The Official Editor will determine how many substantially identical copies will be required for each mailing, with a minimum of 26 and a maximum of 36 allowed. These must be sent either to the OE before the deadline, or postmailed, at the publishers' expense, to each individual member, with the required number of extra copies sent to the OE.

3) Members may frank in material for waitinglisters or nonmembers.

4) Members serving in H M Forces or in the Armed Forces of the United States, or in voluntary service organizations, whose duties prevent them from fulfilling activity requirements, shall be retained as members, providing they acknowledge receipt of the official organ at least every other mailing. Such members shall upon application to the OE receive the mailings at their home address, and a duplicate copy of the official organ at their service address.

5) Members serving in H M Forces or in the Armed Forces of the United States under combat conditions, and members confined in civil or military prisons for crimes of conscience, who are unable to communicate with the OE, shall be retained as members as long as they are in such status.

6) The OE shall make similar arrangements for the benefit of those on the waitlist.

IV. Mailings

- 1) The Official Editor shall designate mailing dates in January, April, July and September. The mailing date shall be published in the official organ of the preceeding mailing.
- 2) The Official Editor shall publish an issue of the XLV for each mailing. This must contain a listing of the contents, postmailings, the roster, a statement of the state of the apa finances, and any other pertinent information which the OE shall deem suitable.
- 3) Material in violation of Postal Regulations may not be included.
- 4) This constitution shall be published in the mailings not less than every other mailing.
- 5) Surplus mailings may be purchased from the OE, on a first-come, first-served basis for the price of \$1 for the first 300 pages, and 25¢ for each additional 100 pages or sizable fraction thereof.

V. Dues

- 1) Dues are one dollar per year.
- 2) Dues are payable before the deadline of the member's last paid up mailing.
- 3) Failure to pay the required dues will result in expulsion from APA-45.

VI. The Official Editor

- 1) The Official Editor shall be elected for a one year term and may succeed himself.
- 2) The Official Editor is the presiding officer of APA-45 and he is in charge of conducting all apa business pursuant to this constitution.
- 3) He is in charge of preparing and mailing quarterly mailings.
- 4) The Official Editor shall appoint an Emergency Officer, who shall serve in the event of the impeachment or incapacitation of the OE, and such other offices he feels necessary.

VII. Elections

- 1) The ballot for the election of an Official Editor, containing the names of all those who have filed for office, shall be distributed with the April mailing.
- 2) The ballots shall be returned to the Teller within six weeks after they are sent out.
- 3) A majority of the votes cast is sufficient to elect.
- 4) The results shall be announced by the July mailing, and the new OE takes office with the October mailing.

VIII. Amendments

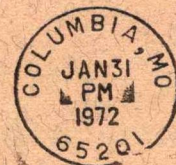
- 1) All amendments must be submitted in writing to the OE.
- 2) The OE must place any proposed amendments on a ballot to be distributed with the first possible mailing.
- 3) Any amendment receiving an affirmative majority of the votes cast shall be considered passing.

IX. Special Rules

Special Rules may be adopted at any time a majority of the members endorse a copy of the proposal if the proposal has been sent to the entire membership at substantially the same time. Such special rules may refuse applicants, expel members, remove officers, over-ride official acts, suspend sections of this constitution, or do anything else within the authority of the organization.
