Dear Fans,

It has been as has been the rule this year, a long time since
 my last letter. This has been a particularly busy year for me in more
 ways than one. It is likely to be December or January before you hear from
 me again. I wish to apologise to all my friends to whom I owe letters and
 particularly some of those overseas. By next year I may be somewhere near
 normal.

As you will see by the new pb lists quite a good selection of
 titles have been published over the last few months in the US. The opposite
 seems to be the position in the UK, no doubt due to the fact that US pbs
 are in the main now being freely imported into England. Ted Carnell has
 covered the British pb situation pretty well in recent issues of New Worlds
 so I won't have any more to say on the subject.

I will have a few odd copies of the majority of the new US pbs
 for sale, so if there are any that you want let me know soon. Eventually
 most of them will be generally available here, but some due to reprint
 rights will not be seen till a British edition is published. This I am
 afraid to say may be anything from a few months to years. Luckily we did
 receive last year's Hugo Award winner quite early (STARSHIP SOLDIER - by
 Robert Heinlein - won the International Fantasy Award now called the 'HUGO'
 in honor of Hugo Gernsback, for 1960), in Four Square. This year's winner
 A CANTICLE for LIEBOWITZ by Walter Miller already available in hard cover
 in a British edition is not listed for pb edition there yet, but has been
 out in the US for some months, this is one we cannot import from the US.
 Next year's winner of the Award, unless I am far wrong or something else
 turns up better in the meantime - THE PILGRIMAGE: THE BOOK OF THE PEOPLE by
 Zenna Henderson from her F&SF stories - is not available to us in the US
 edition. So a British one must be in the offing though it is not announced
 yet.

A good 'Clarke' book is his latest 'A FALL OF MOONDUST' which
 comes up to the standard of Deep Range and is a bit better than Prelude to
 Space and Earthlight, but is more this type of story than the City and
 the Stars or Childhoods End. In other words not his best but still
 definitely a must. It is due for publication in September in UK.

Victor Gollanz publisher who I mentioned last issue was going
 to publish quite a few sf titles including the new Clarke, has now
 announced that they will publish one title in sf each month at least and
 some times two. The main one coming under a general heading of a SF Book
 Choice of the Month. This is something we have been waiting for, for
 sometime. Even the Sidgwick and Jackson Book Club has not really filled
 this need. The covers of the SF Choice are to be of a uniform design. This
 may be at least an improvement on the usual yellow monstrosities.

Very little else is expected from the book publishers but I
 will list all the titles that I have come across to date. The latest
 Heinlein was reviewed recently in LIFE. They called STRANGER in A STRANGE
 LAND 'a satire on sex'. P.J. Farmer successfully started this trend with
 the LOVERS, Sturgeon made a mess of it with VENUS PLUS X and now Heinlein
 is climbing on the band wagon. It looks as though we can expect to see a
 lot of this type of story from now on. Ok, if they are well done we will
 read them, but let's hope we do not see more of the Beacon book type of
 thing which by the way have been discontinued. As yet I do not know if
 Galaxy has made any arrangements with any other publisher regarding the
 Novels, not that I think they had much to do with the Beacon titles
 in the finish.

Due for publication from Gollanz in August was NEEDLE by
 Hal Clement - already on sale at McGills - and GUARDIANS OF TIME by Poul
 Anderson. In September as well as FALL OF MOONDUST is expected SPECTRUM
 by Kingsley Amis and Robert Conquest and THE VOICE OF THE DOLPHIN by
 Dr Leo Szilard. In October DRUNKARD'S WALK by Pohl and FAR OUT by Knight.

S.F. FILMS;

The only show we have seen since my last letter is the Toho production BATTLE IN OUTER SPACE. In previous mentions of Japanese films I have praised their trick photography but this time they have really outdone themselves. The actual 'super dooper' battle with the alien invaders is not quite as spectacular as the MYSTERIANS, but the scenes of the lunar landscape are absolutely terrific. As usual the plot is quite unpretentious but what they could do with a really well written script is no bodys business.

As a comparison one other film we have seen which I tried to forget was I think the worst sf film I have ever seen, GORGO. The photography is certainly no better than the Japanese films like RODAN. The plot, if it had one was absolutely utter drivel. KING KONG was a much better film.

A possible future good one is VOYAGE to the BOTTOM of the SEA starring Walter Pidgeon among others, who you will remember as the professor in the best SF Film so far made FORBIDDEN PLANET. Heavy handed as we have grown to expect from all sf movies, though it may be - I have read the book version re-written by Theodore Sturgeon and a comic version also and Sturgeon's is different slightly and better for it - it should be worth seeing.
