Despite the continuing flowfpaperbacks and books being published nothing really stands out. Heinleins FARNH MS FREEHOLD did not live up to expectations. Then again we expect the best from him and when it does not meet the highest of standards we tend to criticise it a little more harshly. At last the sequal to DUNE WORLD has appeared as a five part serial (scream!) in Analog . This should be reallly good.

Despite my caustic comments on the TV sories OUTER LIMITS in my last report I must admit that some of the recent shows seen here have been slightly terrific. The emphasis on the monsters seems to have been dropped .Eando Binder's I ROBOT was quite well done and one a week or two before called I think the Glass Hand, starring Robert Culp as the the humanoid robot destined to spend thousands of years carrying the the remaining earth population on his person in the form of wire recording. The latest in two parts about an alien life force taking over human bodies to help it build a spaceship is also really good. I would say that with the last few shows of this series SF movies on tv at any rate have at last grown up .Another series just started from England Dr WHO looks as though it may be fun but not to be take seriously. The TV series based on JOUR EY TO THE BOTTOM of the SEA would not have to be much to be better than the original to be an improvement .This is due to start soon on one of the local Channels.

Some years ago there was a flourishing group of SF fans in our sister city .From what I hear they tried to do things in a big way . I attended the 3rd Australian SF Convention and was suitably impressed. It would seem however that things were not all that they seemed and some people could not get their own way and to cut a long story short, they succeeded in putting Aussie Fandam back about 20 years. It is against our nature to be organised in any way and despite brave attempts by various people to organise an Australia wide Organisation nothing very startling has come of it. I am not knocking these efforts but I must admit I have done little towards them myself .What makes fandam tick in the U.S. and England at any rate. The Conventions?What is the main attraction? Big name authors? What contribution to fandam do the fan mags make? Help to make friends of fans many miles apart? Yes! aybe a lot of them are a lot of rubbish but that is not so important, What is all this leading up to at any rate?

Almost as many titles are now being published in England as the US. A large section of the list on the next page is however weird and horror collections and novels. The British HC list is quite a lengthy one but not overly impressive. The main feature is the all out attack on the field by Herbert Jenkins, who will have published more books in the last twelve months in the field than they ever have before. The Sturgeon JOYOUS INVASIONS is probably shorts but should be worthwhile also the BEST from FESF Vol 12 edited by Avrim Davidson. (See McGills advert)Gollancz are still with it having published more than any other British publisher in the field over the last few years. Some have been titled previously out in pb but most have been top class material. With the advent of the new magazine SF HORIZONS - 4/6 in Australia from McGills - it would appear that SF is at last being accepted as worthwhile literature. There is an increasing demand for it in all fields magazines, books, movies and TV. Local authors got a big build up by one of their own in a recent issue of The NATION, in an article by John Baxtercalled our SF Industry. He mentioned some I have never heard of but I know one who is doing quite well and that is Damien Broderick, editor of Monash University paper LOT'S WIFE. We can expect a paperback edition of a collection of his stories sometime soon. MB
