There are options and Ian will be undergoing some of these but the most important thing is that Ian gets 3 WEEKS BREAK! He doesn't go back to see Dr Tony (from The Alfred Hospital) until the 10th July. We might be able to do and see a few people in this time.

After the 10th July, Ian will go into Box Hill Hospital for a day or two and undergo another sort of chemotherapy with a set of drugs. This will cause his white cell count to drop to almost zero within about a week. Then it will shoot back up again.
