

The Age Melbourne Writers' Festival

This year's festival running from August 21 -30 includes Science Fiction, Horror and Fantasy writers Poppy Z Brite, Damien Broderick, Paul Collins, Jack Dann, Catherine Jinks, Rosaleen Love, Dave Luckett, David McRobbie and Michael Pryor, along with artist Graeme Base and keynote speaker, scientist Paul Davies on the topic "Aliens: are they really out there?". Dates of particular interest to science fiction readers include Davies keynote speech on August 21, and panels on August 22 and August 30.

Damien Granted

Damien Broderick notes "I have just been granted \$10,000 by the Arts Development unit of Arts Victoria in support of my current writing project, a popular science book called THE LAST MORTAL GENERATION. This book deals with the social and cultural impact of startling new findings in science, especially in the life sciences, cognitive science and computation, quantum theory, and cosmology, and focusses especially on the prospects of massive human longevity extension (perhaps including rejuvenation) arising from current and foreseeable scientific research. It will be published by New Holland Books in the first half of 1999."

George Turner Prize

Robert Whyte reports "At Phancon on Saturday, the winner of the inaugural George Turner Prize for Science Fiction and Fantasy was announced. The winner was Tansy Rayner Roberts of Lenah Valley, Tasmania for the novel "Splashdance Silver". The prize includes profession publication by Transworld Publishers and a \$10,000 advance against royalties of the book."

Paul Levinson, Ph.D., is Vice President of the Science Fiction and Fantasy Writers of America. His short fiction has been nominated six times in the past two years for Hugo, Nebula, and Sturgeon Awards -- currently his novella, "Loose Ends" (Analog, May 1997) is a Hugo nominee. His most recent nonfiction book -- The Soft Edge: A Natural History and Future of the Information Age_ -- was called "remarkable in both scholarly sweep and lyricism" by the March 1996 WIRED.
