The FFANZ race to New Zealand is on again. In 1995, the Fan Fund for Australia and New Zealand will send an Australian representative to CONQUEST, the New Zealand NatCon in Auckland over Easter. Nominations have now closed. We, the administrators, circulated nomination forms as widely as we were able and they were sent out to previous voters and anyone who expressed interest in FFANZ, as well as being publicised in THYME. The BULLSHEET and STUNGUNN. Despite this, only one nomination was received by the deadline - Donna Heenan. There have been precedents for one-horse races in the past (for example, the 1991 winner was appointed unopposed) but we thought it best to put it to a vote, thus preventing any arguments, ensuring no infringement of fandom's democratic rights and allowing people to express their opinions through the ballot box. Besides, voting is a neat way of raising funds.
