Fandom Ink Irwin Hirsh

I suggested to Marc that mentions of non-Australian fanzines would be a useful addition to The Bullsheet. I thought I was sending a beaut outswinger but all I delivered was a weak full toss, which was hit pass my ear to the boundary. So here I am. The brief given to me is simple: to provide brief descriptions of some of the non-Australian fanzines I receive. This column will appear in The Bullsheet about every four issues.

Martin Tudor's "All Banks Are Bastards" will be of interest to any Aussie following the current debate regarding bank charges and service. Martin's article details his encounters with banks down through the years, with the title giving the idea of that relationship. You'll find the article in Tony Berry's Eyeballs in the Sky 9, an issue built around the theme of Banks. At first glance it would appear to a dull theme for a fanzine, but that ol' fannish initiative comes to the fore and this fanzine rounds out as a fine read. Other articles cover the range from a remembrance of Gordon Banks (England's goalkeeper in the 1966 Soccer World Cup winning side) to an account of working in a blood bank. (Tony Berry, 55 Seymour Rd, Oldbury, Warley, West Midlands, B69 4EP, UK, available for a Letter of Comment, fanzines in trade, contributions, drinks and "large wads of cash.)

Simon Ounsley's "Welcome to the Pleasure Dome" is probably the best fanzine article I've read recently. Published in Simon's Lagoon 6 the article is part con report, part fiction, and skilfully marries effective descriptions of (some of) Simon's encounters at a Novacon with commentary on the nature of those descriptions. Other items in the issue include Simon chatting about a number of matters, Steve Palmer's horror tale of his Neighbours from Hell, and D. West's review of fan art. Noting that art in fanzines is an area which has avoided being a matter of discussion, D's article is intended as a primer, as the spark plug in an attempt to get some discussion going. With a large letter-col, and rounding out at 68 pages, Lagoon 6 is a solid fanzine. (Simon Ounsley, 25 Park Villa Court, Leeds, LS8 IEB, UK, available for a Letter of Comment, fanzines in trade, contributions.)


FTT 17, published by Judith Hanna and Joseph Nicholas, is also a solid fanzine. Not in its size - it is only 30 pages long - but in the depth with which the editors give to the topics discussed. This is not a fanzine to be read when easily distracted. Joseph has a couple of articles, looking

at the failure of sf's technocratic vision and the catalysts for revolution. Judith article isn't as rigorous as Joseph's contribution but it does have a high Aussie fannish content; a personal memoir of the Aussie fandom which Joseph met on his 1981 trip to Australia, the first GUFF trip as an on-going part of the fannish landscape. As with any fanzine FTT has its surprises, and in this issue I was surprised to learn that Marc and Cath Ortlieb have three children [So were Cath and I]. (Judith Hanna & Joseph Nicholas, 15 Jansons Road, South Tottenham, London NI 5 4JU, UK, available for a Letter of Comment, fanzines in trade, contributions and/or UK£1.00),

A different publication to the above three is Concatenation 8. This difference is expressed on a number of levels. Where-as the above three are distributed to a known mailing list, Concat is mainly distributed somewhat more anonymously as a freebie at European conventions. Subsequently the zine's contents and tone has a more general coverage - articles on science fiction and fact. In this way the zine is probably more accessible to people new to fandom as compared to the above three tides. It is also produced with the aid of paid advertising, with almost 20% of its space being ads. This factor influences the editorial content, with the book review section being devoted to titles published by "recent Concatenation advertisers." Not all the books are praised, but giving space to panning an advertiser's book means that books published by (non-advertiser) competitors don't get mentioned. In a note which went out with the mailed copies, the editors express concern about the cost of their postage bill and ask for some response to avoid being trimmed from the mailing list. Nothing wrong with that. They ask for something "more substantial (than) four-line post cards or fanzines in exchange". I agree with them about the postcards, but I'm not sure about rejecting fanzines in trade. It's been some years since I published a fanzine on an on-going basis, but I'd be hard pressed to call the activities involved in publishing and posting a fanzine as being Not Substantial.
