Greg Egan's Permutation City has won the Centre for the Study of Science Fiction's John W. Campbell Award. In addition, Greg's Hugo—nominated story "Cocoon" topped Novelette Category in the Asimov's 9th Annual Readers' Poll. The latter was announced in the September '95 Asimov's which features Greg's story "Luminous". Meanwhile, Lucy Sussex reports "Cathy Tasker, the editor who was behind the Harper Collins (oz) Moonstone imprint of juvenile sf, has been sacked. What this does to the list I dunno.
