## THE DUFF BALLOT 1997

#### North America to Australasia

The Down Under Fan Fund (DUFF) was created in 1972 to exchange fannish representatives between North America and Australasia. DUFF is supported by voluntary contributions from fans all over the world. DUFF delegates attend Worldcon® or a national convention in the host country and visit fans they might otherwise never meet in person. Delegates are responsible for raising funds and administering DUFF until a new delegate from their continent is elected, and are expected to publish trip reports which can be sold to aid the fund.

**Donations:** DUFF exists solely on the donations and contributions of fans and fan organizations. Please give generously. Anyone may contribute, and donations in excess of the voting donation are gratefully accepted. Checks should be made payable to DUFF (in North America) or Perry Middlemiss (in Australasia). Money should always be sent in the administrator's home currency.

Voting: DUFF uses the preferential system of balloting to guarantee an automatic runoff and a majority win. The voter ranks the candidates in order of preference (1, 2, 3 ...). If there is no absolute majority for one candidate after the first count of votes, first-place votes for the lowest-ranking candidate are dropped and the second-place votes on those ballots are assigned to the candidates named. This goes on until one candidate has a majority. It is therefore important to vote for second, third, etc. places, especially if you choose to write in a candidate. (The voter is not required to fill in more than their name, address and first choice.) Ballots must be signed and accompanied by a donation of at least \$4 in United States currency or \$6 in Australian currency. You must return the entire ballot (both sides). Each voter may vote only once.

Voters' eligibility: Anyone who has been active in fandom on or before January 1, 1996 may vote. "Active in fandom" means involved in fannish pursuits such as fanzine writing or reading; convention running or attending; amateur film/video production; or club participation. Voting is limited to natural persons. If you think you may be unknown to the administrators, please give the name of a fan or fan group (other than a candidate or nominator) who can vouch that you meet this criteria.

Candidates: Three North American fans and two Australasian fans have stood as nominators for each of the three candidates. Each candidate has provided a \$25 bond; a brief written platform and a description of previous Australian travel; and promised (barring acts of God) to travel to BasiCon2, in, Melbourne, Australia, September, 27 & 28, 1997, and to serve as administrator of the fund until a new North American delegate is elected.

Deadline: Ballots must be postmarked by April 1, 1997 & reach an administrator by April 10, 1997.

The Constitution of the Australian National SF Convention states, re awards: "The Convention Committee for each Australian SF Convention will, by a vote of the Convention members, after a nominating process involving Australian fandom generally, award up to six Australian SF ("Ditmar") Awards (of which, at least, one must be for fannish endeavours) and the William Atheling Ir Award for Criticism or Review. For this purpose the Basicon 2 committee has appointed a sub-committee.

On the reverse side of this form there is a nominating form, which may be filled out by any member of Australian Fandom. The Sub-Committee will accept up to five nominations in each category from each nominator. There is no obligation to nominate in all categories.

Definitions of Categories

- 1. BEST AUSTRALIAN LONG FICTION: A science fiction or fantasy story, anthology or single author collection of 17,500 words or more by an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia which was published for the first time in the 1996 calendar year or was first generally available in Australia during that year.
- 2. BEST AUSTRALIAN SHORT FICTION: A science fiction or fantasy story of less than 17,500 words written by an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia which was published for the first time in the 1996 calendar year or was first generally available in Australia during that year.
- 3. BEST FANZINE: A non-professional publication devoted to science fiction, fantasy or related subjects produced by an Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia which was produced and generally available in 1996.
- 4. BEST FAN WRITER: An Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia who wrote material which appeared in a fanzine produced and generally available in 1996.
- 5. BEST FAN ARTIST: An Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia whose artwork (of whatever description) appeared in a generally available fanzine or through other public display in 1996. An artist does not qualify for this award for any artwork which they were paid to produce. Artwork for public display must have as its theme, science fiction, fantasy or related subjects.
- 6. BEST PROFESSIONAL ARTWORK: An Australian citizen or permanent resident of Australia whose original artwork was produced by commission or for sale in 1996. The artwork must have as its theme, science fiction, fantasy or related subjects and have been publicly visible in 1996 eg by display or as a magazine or book cover.

7. THE WILLIAM ATHELING IR, AWARD FOR CRITICISM OR REVIEW: For a particular piece of criticism or review of science fiction or fantasy, or a body of shorter items, where the work or works first appeared in Australia in 1996.
