Steve Paulsen reports "I've just heard that Gazelle Books in the UK will be distributing my young adult dark fantasy book *The Stray Cat* in Britain. On top of this, I've just received my author's copy of the Bahasia Indonesian edition, and we're currently in negotiations with two European publishers. All editions will include Shaun Tan's wonderful illustrations. Shaun is currently going from strength to strength, having just completed a picture book with Gary Crew called *The Viewer*, he is currently working on a picture book with John Marsden."
