In the near future Janice Murray and I will be publishing administrators' newsletters detailing the current finances of the fund as well as lists of voters. Given the fact that next year's Worldcon will be held in Melbourne, Janice and I are anticipating a sizable field of candidates from North America. In order to give everyone plenty of time to nominate, campaign and vote we will be announcing the dates for the 1999 race in the next few months."
