Some. Revised version of an amendment to the By-Laws, previously discussed.

CLJ II mentioned that Gavin corrected our procedures, so that members need to be notified of the special voting at the next meeting.

As it reads presently:

Article III: Directors.

Section 1. Number and Qualifications.

- A. The authorized number of Directors, as stated in the Articles of Incorporation, is eleven.
- Each Director must be 18 years of age or older at the time of their election.
- C. When elected, and continuously while serving, each Director shall meet the following qualifications:
 - Be an Attending Member, and have maintained such Attending Membership for at least 156 regular Society meetings;
 - 2. Be an Attending Member continuously during the previous 52 regular Society meetings, unless prevented from doing so by a medical condition or by being temporarily absent from the area;

 Reside within Los Angeles County, Kern County, Orange County, Riverside County, San Bernardino County, or Ventura County;

It is proposed to revise the By-Laws as follows:

Revise III.1.C.3. to read:

3. Reside in the states of California, Nevada, Arizona, or Oregon.

Insert III.1.D. and III.1.E. as follows:

D. At no time shall there be more than three Directors residing outside of Los Angeles County, Kern County, Orange County, Riverside County, San Bernardino County, or Ventura County.

E. In the event that three Directors already reside outside of the counties specified in III.1.C.3., and another Director changes residence to one outside of the counties specified in III.1.C.3., that Director shall be required to vacate their office as a Director. ["In the event that" instead of "Should an occasion arise" and "vacate" instead of "forfeit"]

Renumber all following paragraphs appropriately.

This will require a 2/3 vote of attending members to pass.

Marcia Minsky and Joe Zeff emailed the following:

This is from a friend of mine. Thought I'd pass it along to you.

I have had many CPR classes over the years but was never told this: Have you ever thought about [this]: When you are alone and have a heart attack, what are you gonna do then? ...

- 1. ... Let's say it's 5:25 p.m. and you're driving home after an unusually hard day's work.
- 2. You are really tired and frustrated. All of a sudden [you feel] chest pains. They are starting to radiate in the arm and jaw. It feels like being stabbed in the chest and heart. You're only a few miles away from the nearest hospital or home.
- 3. Unfortunately, you don't know if you can make it...
- 4. Maybe you've taken CPR training, but the person running the course hasn't told you how to help yourself.
- 5. How do you survive a heart attack when you're alone when it happens? A person who is feeling weak and whose heart is beating hard has only about 10 seconds before losing consciousness.
- 6. But you can help yourself by coughing repeatedly and very strongly! Deep breaths before every cough. Coughing should be repeated every second until you arrive at the hospital or until your heart starts to beat normally.

7. Deep breathing gives oxygen to your lungs and coughing movements boost the heart and blood circulation. Heart pressure also helps to restore a normal heartbeat. Here's how cardiac arrest victims can make it to the hospital for the right treatment.

..

9. For women: You should know that women have additional and different symptoms. [They] rarely have crushing chest pain or pain in the arms. [They] often have indigestion and tightness across the back at the bra line plus sudden fatigue.

Nevertheless she regenerated!

A 2019 article posted by the University of Chicago Medicine (https://tinyurl.com/heartattack-coughing) suggests that while there is some truth to the above, "[M]ost heart rhythms are more complex than a single cough can handle. ... Simply coughing will not always correct an irregular chaotic rhythm, and it cannot prevent the patient from going into cardiac arrest."

The article indicates that the best initial response is to call 911. If you or someone else is properly trained, start CPR and, if available, use an automatic external defibrillator (AED).
