Old Business None

New Business: By-Laws discussion and vote Charles Lee Jackson II described the process for voting on the proposed By-Laws change. Matthew B. Tepper will read the text and questions can be answered. We will take a show of hands, and if the motion passes tonight, we'll vote again. There will be no discussion next week, so if you have any questions, tonight is the time to ask them.

Matthew B. Tepper: There is a proposal that has been passed to the club by the board of directors to amend the LASFS By-Laws. As it currently stands:

> Article III, Section 1, Part C C. When elected, and continuously while serving, each Director shall meet the following qualifications:

 Be an Attending Member, and have maintained such Attending Membership for at least 156 regular Society meetings;
Be an Attending Member continuously during the previous 52 regular Society meetings, unless prevented from doing so by a medical condition or by being temporarily absent from the area;

 Reside within Los Angeles County, Kern County, Orange County, Riverside County, San Bernardino County, or Ventura County;
Not have been declared of unsound mind by a final order of court; and

5. Meet such additional activity requirements as the Board may establish pertaining to activities of the Board itself.

The Board, by a majority vote of the directors who meet all of the required qualifications to be a director, may declare vacant the office of any Director who fails or ceases to meet any of the above qualifications that was in effect at the beginning of that director's current term of office.

The change that the board ultimately decided on would be to change Part 3, which is "Reside within Los Angeles County, Kern County, Orange County, Riverside County, San Bernardino County, or Ventura County." That is to be changed to, "Reside within the states of California, Nevada, Arizona, and Oregon." Seven voted in favor, and one opposed; the measure passed from the board of directors to the club. Jackson: Please note that we did not change any other sections of the By-Laws, just that one, which is opening up the physical space that can be occupied by a member of the board of the club. Are there questions?

LASFS members asked why the board wants to make the change—and why those specific states. Board members explained their reasoning—online communications, where active members now live—as well as past precedent expanding where board members can live. Members expressed concern that there was no stipulation that a majority of the board reside in the Los Angeles area, and that the current proposal could lead to hostile takeover attempts.

After lively, thoughtful discussion, the question was called. Six people voted for the amendment as proposed. 18 voted against and there were a couple abstentions. Johnson announced that the motion was voted down and sent back to the board with recommendations. Additional recommendations were requested via email before the next board meeting.

Agenda Items

Business before the board: The proposed By-Laws change was rejected by majority vote at the April 11 meeting, and the sense of the meeting was that it should be returned to the board for retooling and possible resubmission.

Board discussion of changing regional requirements: From the LASFS By-Laws—

Article III: Directors.

Section 1. Number and Qualifications. A. The authorized number of Directors, as stated in the Articles of Incorporation, is eleven.

B. Each Director must be 18 years of age or older at the time of their electionC. When elected, and continuously while serving, each Director shall meet the following qualifications:

 Be an Attending Member, and have maintained such Attending Membership for at least 156 regular Society meetings;
Be an Attending Member continuously during the previous 52 regular Society meetings, unless prevented from doing so by a medical condition or by being temporarily absent from the area;

3. Reside within Los Angeles County, Kern County, Orange County, Riverside County, San Bernardino County, or Ventura County;

Alternatives suggested at the April 11 meeting: Make a rule that a majority of the Board members be local. (Dr. Susie Searight and Scott Beckstead) Define "majority": 50 percent plus one? Two-thirds? Three-fourths? (Sherri Benoun) Clarify "local": Los Angeles County, or the adjacent counties as in the current section III.1.C.1. (Heide Nichols) Add Clark County, Nevada. Precedent: Society for Creative Anachronism, Kingdom of Caid. (Susan Fox)

Discussion: Eylat Poliner likes the idea of the majority of board members residing in the designated counties. Cathy Johnson suggests this go to a By-Laws committee instead of a board meeting. Christian B. McGuire: The sense at the meeting was a simple majority in the designated counties, not two-thirds, but a supermajority would be better than 50 percent plus one. Heide Nichols was contacted by three people that said more than six out of 11 would be better. Elayne Pelz moved to send to a committee. The motion passed.

Matthew B. Tepper will head a committee to be conducted by email, in order to not delay it for two months. Heide Nichols, Elayne Pelz, and Susan Fox will serve on the By-Laws committee. Deferred to committee, to approve something to pass to the procedural meeting.

Possible discussion of the KCET PBS *Lost L.A.* interviews: Guest at the in-person meeting—Jaime Morgan Muñoz, producer, wants to do a segment on science fiction writers and fans in Los Angeles. Matthew B. Tepper and Charles Lee Jackson II held a Zoom call with Muñoz to talk about the history. Tepper can connect anyone else who wants to do an interview. (Check your email.)

Open Forum

(Including discussion of the status of what, for want of a better code phrase, I shall term the Yolanda Project)

Elayne Pelz has not been able to do anything because of being out of town and then her injury, but she will work this coming week to create an offer letter, including proof of funds. She does not think it will be accepted, but who knows? We're looking into getting the property rezoned because the owner won't do it. We will need a lawyer for that. Sandy Cohen recommends a "CR" zoning because there is residential property on the other side. Our offer will be \$900,000. The owner wants \$1.2 million because Zillow listed it that way, but because it has been on the market since October 2023 and we have cash, let's see what happens. Pelz is looking into a mortgage of \$100.000 for fixing the place up, legal, and other fees.

Heide Nichols, who makes a living buying and selling real estate: You could put in the cash offer to take it "as is." He might want to not spend money to bring things up to code, so that could be a better bargaining chip. Nichols has checklists of things to do. Christian B. McGuire requested that the board obtain that checklist.

Eylat Poliner moved that Pelz move forward as she sees fit. The motion passes.

Heide Nichols: About postcards for Loscon as effective marketing tools—Susan Fox mentioned LASFS postcards for the club itself. There used to be a brochure. Could we do that again?

Michelle Pincus wants to reprint the bookmarks once we have a clubhouse as an address for people to visit. She will discuss doing that for the current Zoom and hybrid meetings with Krystal Rains. The matter was referred to Pincus and Rains.

Eylat Poliner: We are missing our green cards for guests at in-person meetings. Poliner will print new ones from the original files. Rob Powell would like to be aware of work on the bookmarks and green cards.
