

# The Machine Stops Robert Jennings



The November 1909 issue of *The Oxford & Cambridge Review* contained the novelette "The Machine Stops", a striking science fiction story about the dangers of humanity's future dependence on advanced technology. Recognized immediately as a brilliant "scientific-fantasy," the story helped to further polish the reputation of its author, E.M. Forster.

Foster had already established himself as an insightful literary author with astute and interesting human interest fiction, critical reviews and social commentary. His first novel "Where Angels Fear To Tread" had been published in 1905 to widespread literary acclaim. His literary reputation was already well established. While contemplating future novels he wrote literary critiques and short stories. Most of his short stories were fantasies with allegorical themes concerning social class in Edwardian Britain, and the goals that humans set for themselves in order to survive in modern civilization.

"The Machine Stops" was a story that we would today immediately class as science fiction. The theme was not exactly original. Years later Forster admitted that he wanted to create a tale based on the ideas that H. G. Welles had proposed in his story "The Time Machine", of a civilized and gentle society of humans living underground, while the surface was inhabited by brutal tribesmen without the benefits of scientific progress. In reality it was also a sharp attack on Welles' vision of a scientific ultra-conformist

scientifically safe future as outlined in his 1905 novel "A Modern Utopia:" In "The Machine Stops" Forster succeeded admirably.

The story deals with a future civilization that has embraced scientific technology so advanced that humans do no work. A central machine manages all the apparatuses that care for the future humans, providing luxurious housing, free food, free clothing, and every other necessity of life. Disease and other illnesses have been banished by humanity being confined to underground sanitized living quarters. Travel within the underground regions is available, but discouraged. Humans communicate with radio-televisors, knowledge is available on video-screens with books housed in a massive central library. Humans spend their time interacting with each other. They also try to develop new philosophical concepts, or critique the ideas their friends and families are discussing.

Problems develop when the story's protagonist makes an unauthorized visit to the surface thru an air shaft and discovers other humans living in primitive savagery. Difficulties arise when the machine began to develop glitches. The central machine decides to ban respirators and all travel to the surface, then creates a god-cult with the machine itself as the new deity.

Things continue to go wrong, but the central Machine Committee declines to discuss it, insisting that these matters will be taken care of in due time. Instead, more things break down. The Mending Machines that do repairs are malfunctioning, and as the humans realize that the central machine intelligence is unable to fix itself, the humans also realize that they have forgotten how to make the necessary repairs themselves. The machine abruptly stops completely. The underground human civilization collapses in ruins, causing total massive death for the humans who had lived under the benign reign of the Machine.

The novelette made a strong impression when it was first published. For some reason it was not included in Forster's first collection of fantasies "The Celestial Omnibus and Other Stories" (1911), but it had received enuf public comment that it was collected along with other more recent Forster short works in "The Eternal Moment and Other Short Stories" (1928). When it was reprinted yet again in a new, expanded collection of his short fiction published in 1947 Forster felt impelled to write a short forward to the story discussing its theme and explaining his inspiration from the Wells Time Machine tale.

Along the way another author, Victory Barclay, writing under the name Wayland Smith, wrote his one and only science fiction story, a novel also titled "The Machine Stops", published in the UK in 1936, and subsequently reprinted in the US in the March, 1945 issue of *Famous Fantastic Mysteries*. The similarities between this novel and Forster's novelette were immediately apparent, but it appears that Forster, who was enjoying the financial and critical success of his last novel and was employed as a radio commentary for the BBC when the Wayland Smith book was published, did not file any legal actions against Barclay.

Forster's story already enjoyed a strong reputation in science fiction fandom and the general SF community but it really reached a wider audience when Groff Conklin included it in two of his pivotal science fiction anthologies in the 1950s. By this time computers, television, space travel, and international telex communications, along with hundreds of other technology advances had occurred causing a lot of people to wonder where the world of science was taking human civilization.

:The Machine Stops" was a stark, vivid and intense warning of what might happen if the human race forgot its human roots and began to reply too heavily on technological developments which were already rushing along at a near tsunami pace.

Between 1954 and 1965 the story was reprinted ten times. Between 1965 and 1975 the story was reprinted 22 times. In this new century "The Machine Stops' has been reprinted 68 times in the English language alone, with many more reprints in other nations outside the US and the UK.

Interested fans can read this story for free on any number of internet sites, including Project Guttenberg, The Internet Archives, LibriVox, and Goodreads.

The message has obviously become clearer, sharper, and more alarming with the passage of time. Science continues to march on, and our civilization has become more and more dependent on complex technologies that only a small percentage of the population understands. The development of artificial intelligence linked to these new technologies has added a shriller and even more urgent message to the chorus. It is a warning from the past about the dangers of the future that has become even more urgent in this new century, a warning we would do well to heed.

Bob Jennings has been involved in fandom since the late 1950s, and is one of the original founding members of comics fandom, founding the SFPA and publishing hundreds of fanzines. From 1979 to 2000, Bob ran a science fiction/comics/game store, which is now all mail order. He's currently at work to develop a device that will zap robo-callers and internet spammers.

# October 2024 New Fantasy and Science Fiction Releases Walter Bruce Sinclair, White Dwarf Books, Vancouver

# • Ajram, Sofia. Coup De Grace. Titan, 22.99 hc.

144 pages. Vicken has a plan. Throw himself into the Saint Lawrence River in Montreal and end it all for good, believing it to be the only way out for him after a lifetime of depression and pain. But, stepping off the subway, he finds himself in an endless, looping station. Though he is determined to find a way out again, no matter how many claustrophobic hallways or vast cathedral-esque rooms he passes through, the exit is nowhere in sight.

#### • Alderson, Ben. A Betrayal of Storms [Realm of Fey #1]. Angry Robot, 24.99 tp.

Half-fey Robin Vale is taken to Wychwood, the fey realm, where everyone is focused on preparing for war against the humans who hate, hunt, and kill them for coin. Robin doesn't understand how he fits into the fey's plans... until he's revealed to be the lost heir to the Icethorn Court. But by claiming the throne with the help of his devastatingly handsome personal guard, Erix, Robin's very presence opposes the long-planned invasion.

# • Armstrong, Kelley. I'll Be Waiting. St. Martin's, 24.99 tp.

Nicola Laughton never expected to see adulthood, being diagnosed with Cystic Fibrosis as a child. Then medical advances let her live into her thirties and she met Anton, who taught her to dream of a future... together. Months after they married, Anton died in a horrible car crash, but lived long enough to utter five words to her, "I'll be waiting for you." For the seance, Nicola's friends rent the Lake Erie beach house that Anton's family once owned. But, unbeknownst to the others, this isn't her first time contacting the dead. And Nicola isn't her real name. That's when she finds the first body...

## • Asher, Neal. World Walkers. Tor UK, 33.99 tp.

Standalone set in the same universe as the OWNER TRILOGY. When Ottanger is thrown from his timeline to the far future he meets the Fenris, humanity's future form. Ottanger is a survivor of the Fenris' altruistic experiment to create world walkers, their goal to help humanity escape their decaying version of Earth. But there is a form of humanity, anathema to the Fenris, that functions as one mind, and the trillion-strong hive has noticed the Fenris' experiments with world walkers and wants that technology.

#### • August, Riley. The Last Gifts of the Universe. Hanover Square, 31.00 hc.

Scout is an Archivist who scours the dead worlds of the cosmos for their last gifts of interesting technology, cultural rituals - anything left behind that might be useful to the Home worlds and their survival. During an excavation on a lifeless planet, Scout unearths something unbelievable, a surviving message from an alien who witnessed the worldending entity thousands of years ago. Now Scout, their brother and their sometimes fearless, space-faring cat, Pumpkin, must race to save what matters most.

#### • Blake, Olivie. Januaries: Stories of Love, Magic, & Betrayal. Tor, 38.99 hc.

A collection of short fiction featuring fourteen magical ruminations on life, death, and the love - or desire for revenge - that outlasts both.

#### • Brody, A. L. Dating & Dismemberment. Entangled, 23.99 tp.

Darla Drake, Duchess of Death, is a legendary monster who has haunted the woods around Camp Clear Creek for years. Until an existential crisis forces her to take a sabbatical from wreaking havoc on pimply teens while she figures out what she really wants from the rest of her (possibly infinite) life. So she's spending time with the decapitated - yet still overbearing - head of her mother, reading romance novels she steals from campers, and struggling with one monstrous

case of melancholy. Until Jarko Murkvale arrives in Clear Creek. Jarko is conceited, arrogant, infuriating, and unfortunately for Darla, kind of hot.

# • Brom. Evil In Me. Tor Nightfire, 41.99 hc.

Brom's newest novel of possession, damnation, and rock 'n' roll where one woman must get the world singing in order to save her soul. This devilish tale includes nearly two dozen of Brom's immersive paintings.

## • Burnham, Sophie. Sargassa. [Ex Romana]. DAW, 37.99 hc.

Told from multiple POVs: a young heiress, an undercover spy, a bastard brother and a fugitive who has history with all three; Sargassa is equal parts political intrigue, queer romance, and revolution. 22 year old Imperial Historian Selah Kleios is custodian of more than just the Imperial Archives. There's also the question of the two puzzling classified items her father left in her care - an ancient atlas filled with landscapes that don't exist, and a carved piece of stone that seems to do nothing at all.

## • Butcher, Jim. The Olympian Affair. [The Cinder Spires #2]. Ace, 25.99 tp.

A trading summit at Spire Olympia provides an opportunity for the Spirearch, Lord Albion, to secure alliances that will shape the outcomes of the war, and to that end he dispatches privateer Captain Francis Madison Grimm and the crew of the AMS Predator to bolster the Spirearch's diplomatic agents. It will take daring, skill, and no small amount of showmanship to convince the world to stand with Spire Albion - assuming that it is not already too late.

# Cherryh, C. J. & Jane S. Fancher. Alliance Unbound [Hinder Stars #2]. DAW, 41.00 hc.

When Cyteen opened up FTL, it gave the technology for free to any ship that could reach it; and with that technology, it provided a map of jump-points, points of mass enabling starships to navigate hyperspace safely. The map of jump-points, however, stopped with the route to Alpha - thus excluding Sol, and Earth, and the Earth Company, whose gateway to the stars was Alpha. But Sol intends to take back control of its star-stations and stop Cyteen's unbridled expansion, however it can. To do that, they are willing to starve Alpha and concentrate their efforts on a huge FTLer capable of carrying military force.

#### • Chronister, Kay. *The Bog Wife*. Counterpoint, 36.00 hc.

Since time immemorial, the Haddesley family has tended the cranberry bog. The staunch seasons of their lives are governed by a strict covenant that is renewed each generation with the ritual sacrifice of their patriarch, and in return, the bog produces a "bog-wife." Brought to life from vegetation, this woman is meant to carry on the family line. But when the bog fails - or refuses - to honour the bargain, the Haddesleys, a group of discordant siblings still grieving the mother who mysteriously disappeared years earlier, face an unknown future.

# • Clarke, August. Metal From Heaven. Erewhon, 37.99 hc.

A bloody lesbian revenge tale and political fantasy set in a glittering world transformed by industrial change - and simmering class warfare. He who controls ichorite controls the world. A malleable metal more durable than steel, ichorite is a toxic natural resource fueling national growth, and ambitious industrialist Yann Chauncey helms production of this miraculous ore. Working his foundry is an underclass of destitute workers...

#### • Clarke, Susanna. The Wood at Midwinter. Bloomsbury, 22.99 hc.

64 pages. An illustrated short story. 19-year-old Merowdis Scot is an unusual girl. She can talk to animals and trees-and she is only ever happy when she is walking in the woods. One snowy afternoon, out with her dogs and Apple the pig, Merowdis encounters a blackbird and a fox. As darkness falls, a strange figure enters in their midst-and the path of her life is changed forever.

#### • Clarke, Susanna. The Ladies of Grace Adieu: And Other Stories. Bloomsbury, 23.99 tp.

10 stories set in the same world as Jonathan Strange & Mr. Norell.

## • Cooke, C. J. *The Book of Witching*. HarperCollins, 25.99 tp.

Glasgow 2024: Clem waits by her daughter's hospital bed. Erin was found on an idyllic beach in Fynhallow Bay, Orkney with catastrophic burns and only one memory: her name is Nyx. But how did she get these burns? And how did her boyfriend end up burned alive? Orkney 1594: accused of witchcraft, Alison Balfour awaits trial. The punishment? To be burned alive. Separated by four hundred years but bound by the Book of Witching, two women stand imperiled.

#### • Costa, Mariana. Shoestring Theory. Angry Robot, 24.99 tp.

Former grand-mage of the high court, Cyril Laverre, has spent the last decade hiding himself away in a ramshackle hut by the sea, trying to catch any remaining fish for his cat familiar, Shoestring, and suppressing his guilt over the kingdom's ruin. When Shoestring wanders away and dies one morning, Cyril takes his remaining lifeblood and casts a powerful spell that catapults him back in time to a happier period of Farsalan history - to when Cyril and Prince Eufrates's tentative romance had not yet bloomed.

#### • Crouch, Blake. Run. Ballantine, 24.99 tp.

Five days ago, the epidemic of rage began. Four days ago, the rash of senseless murders swept the nation. Three days ago, the president addressed the country and begged for peace - even as the murders increased tenfold. Two days ago, the killers began to mobilize. One day ago, the power went out. And tonight, the killers are reading the names of those to be killed over the Emergency Broadcast System. In Albuquerque Jack Colclough has just heard his name on his battery-powered radio. People are coming to his house to kill him, his wife, his daughter, and his son. He has no idea what's happening, or why, but the time for questions is long past. His only chance is to run.

# • Dara, Maxie. A Grim Reaper's Guide to Catching a Killer [Scythe Mystery]. Berkley, 25.99 tp.

Kathy Valence is forty-two, mid-divorce, and pregnant with her ex's baby. She's also a modern-day grim reaper employed by S.C.Y.T.H.E., but frankly that's the easiest part of her life right now. Or at least it was, until her latest client's soul goes missing. When she finally tracks down seventeen-year-old Conner Ortiz, he angrily denies he died of natural causes, despite what his file says. He insists that someone at S.C.Y.T.H.E. murdered him, and he demands Kathy find out who and why.

# • Datlow, Ellen (ed). Christmas and Other Horrors: An Anthology of Solstice Horror. Titan, 24.99 tp.

A horror anthology of original short stories exploring the endless terrors of winter solstice traditions across the globe, featuring Tananarive Due, Stephen Graham Jones, Alma Katsu and many more.

#### • Davis-Goff, Sarah. Silent City. Flatiron, 23.99 tp.

Outside the walls of Phoenix City a plague has overrun Ireland -- one bite from the savage skrake means death or infection. Inside, the city is ruled by an oppressive and ruthless elite, their rule enforced by Orpen and the banshees - a fierce, all-women force of fighters. But when two women are publicly executed, Orpen knows she must make a choice between guaranteed survival within a cruel society or treacherous freedom beyond the walls.

#### • Dawson, Delilah S. It Will Only Hurt for a Moment. Del Rey, 38.99 hc.

Sarah Carpenter is leaving behind her unsupportive, narcissistic ex-boyfriend and alcoholic, abusive mother - and is headed for a new beginning at Tranquil Falls, a secluded artists' colony on the grounds of a closed hotel. There, with no cell signal or internet to distract her, she hopes to rediscover her love for pottery and put the broken pieces of her life back

together. But when Sarah uncovers the body of a young woman while digging a hole for a pit kiln, things start to fall apart.

• Day, David. Atlas of Tolkien Deluxe Edition [Middle-Earth Maps]. Thunder Bay, 26.99 hc.

Full-color maps and illustrations from every reach of Middle-earth make this an essential guide to exploring Tolkien's world. It features an embossed and foil-stamped cover, plus gilded edges.

• Dimova, Genoveva. Monstrous Nights [Witch's Compendium of Monsters #2]. Tor, 24.99 tp.

With her magic reclaimed and her role in the community of Chernograd restored, Kosara is now in possession of twelve witch's shadows. Across the wall in Belograd, Asen chases the only lead on his latest case, one of several unsolved witch murders, even against the orders of his direct superior and the mayor. He's convinced the smuggling kingpin Konstantin Karaivanov is behind them, and follows his trail to an underground monster auction - which leads him right back to Chernograd.

• Dinniman, Matt. Carl's Doomsday Scenario [Dungeon Crawler Carl #2]. Ace, 39.99 hc.

Now on the third floor, Carl and Donut have already proven that a Coast Guard vet and once-and-forever feline royalty are an almost unstoppable team. But the dungeon gets more dangerous each day, and now there's the Over City. A sprawling, once-thriving metropolis devastated by a mysterious calamity. An undead circus trawls the ruins. Murdered women rain from the sky. An ancient spell is finally ready to reveal its dark purpose.

• Dinniman, Matt. The Dungeon Anarchist's Cookbook [Dungeon Crawler Carl #3]. Ace, 39.99 hc.

Carl and Donut have survived so far, but this fourth level is unlike anything they could imagine. The Iron Tangle is an impossibly complicated subway system tied together into a knot of trains of all kinds, from classic steam engines to sleek modern cars. Up is down. Down is up. Close is far. The cars are filled with monsters, the railway stations aren't always what they seem, and the exit is perpetually just a few stops away.

• Doocy, Maiga. Sorcery and Small Magics [The Wildersongs Trilogy #1]. Orbit, 25.99 tp.

Impulsive sorcerer Leovander Loveage and his curmudgeonly rival Sebastian Grimm venture deep into a magical forest in search of a counterspell that can break the curse between them - only to discover that magic might not be the only thing pulling them together.

• El-Fassi, Nadia. Best Hex Ever. Dell, 24.95 tp.

As a skilled kitchen witch, Dina Whitlock knows her way around a pastry recipe. In fact, she runs her very own London cafe, serving magic-infused treats. However, only a few select friends know about her magical abilities or the hex that has plagued her love life. It's hard to fall in love when your partner is guaranteed to have a string of bad luck the moment they develop feelings for you.

• Ellison, Harlan (ed). Last Dangerous Visions [Dangerous Visions]. Blackstone, 24.95 tp (also in hc, 38.95).

But someone is desperate to keep the past buried, plotting to destroy the meadow...

#### • Flint, Eric & Jody Lynn Nye. 1635: The Weaver's Code [Ring of Fire #37]. Baen, 37.00 hc.

that actually scares her - introduce her very religious, very human relatives to her fiancé, the newly crowned vampire king of America.

#### • Hand, Elizabeth. A Haunting on the Hill. Mulholland, 24.99 tp.

An authorized return to the world of Shirley Jackson's *The Haunting of Hill House*. Struggling playwright Holly Sherwin has received a grant to develop her play, The Witch of Edmonton. All she needs now is time and space to bring her vision to life. And when she stumbles across Hill House on a weekend getaway upstate, she knows she's found the perfect place to develop and rehearse her play.

## • Harrison, Kim. Demon's Bluff [Hollows #18]. Ace, 39.99 hc.

Kit Sharp is in Paris, working as an archivist, having inherited her historian father's fascination with the Bayeux Tapestry, believing it a tool for prediction. The Nazis are also convinced that the tapestry will aid them in their invasion of Britain. Ivy Sharp, having demonstrated her extraordinary powers of perception, has been dropped into Northern France on a special mission.

#### • Herbert, Brian & Kevin J. Anderson. *Princess of Dune* [Dune #12]. Tor, 26.99 tp.

Raised in the Imperial court and born to be a political bargaining chip, Irulan was sent at an early age to be trained as a Bene Gesserit Sister. The young woman has a wise and independent streak and is determined to become much more than a pawn to be moved about on anyone's gameboard. A collection of Lansdale's irreverent Lovecraftian tributes, merging his classic gonzo stylings with the eldritch vibes of H. P. Lovecraft.

#### • Leede, CJ. American Rapture. Nightfire, 36.99 hc.

A virus is spreading across America, transforming the infected and making them feral with lust. Sophie, a good Catholic girl, must traverse the hellscape of the Midwest to try to find her family while the world around her burns. Along the way she discovers there are far worse fates than dying a virgin... The end times are coming.

# • Livingston, Michael. Seaborn [The Seaborn Cycle #1]. AdAstra, 26.99 tp.

#### Mayo, Laura J. How to Summon a Fairy Godmother [Fairies and Familiars #1]. Orbit, 24.99 tp.

Lady Theodosia Balfour's stepsister, the newly crowned Princess Beatrice, is telling everyone that Theo, her sister, and their mother are evil people who treated her like a slave. Not exactly true. With the Balfour family estate on the verge of bankruptcy, Theo's only path forward is a forced betrothal to the Duke of Snowbell, a foul-tempered geezer. Theo needs a fairy godmother, like the one who supposedly helped her stepsister snag a prince.

#### McDonald, Ed. Traitor of Redwinter [Redwinter Chronicles #2]. Tor, 26.99 tp.

The power of the Sixth Gate grows stronger within Raine each day - to control it, she needs lessons no living Draoihn can teach her, lessons hidden in the ever-changing pages of the book. Amidst threats old and new, Raine must learn the secrets promised by the book, magic promised by a queen with a crown of feathers. A queen to whom Raine has promised more than she can afford to give...

#### • McWalter, Keith G. Lifers. SparkPress, 24.95 tp.

In the year 2050, the man known as Zinn is on the run from the consequences of his greatest creation: an artificial genome that wildly increases the human lifespan. Her cousin is to get married the next morning, but only if she can escape the murderous attack of a ghost-bride, who used to be engaged to her groom. A supernatural possession helps Bata battle and vanquish the vengeful ghost bride, and following a botched exorcism, she is transported to Ibaja-La, the realm of dead brides. There, she receives secret powers to fight malevolent ghost-brides before being sent back to the human realm.

# • Parry, H. G. The Scholar and the Last Faerie Door. Redhook, 25.99 tp.

Camford, 1920. Gilded and glittering, England's secret magical academy is no place for Clover, a commoner with neither connections nor magical blood. She tells herself she has fought her way there only to find a cure for her brother Matthew, one of the few survivors of a faerie attack on the battlefields of WWI which left the doors to faerie country sealed, the study of its magic banned, and its victims cursed. An escape from their tumultuous pasts. But they don't have long to enjoy their newfound peace before they are violently separated and dragged to opposite ends of the Earth.

## • Penaranda, Chloe C. The Stars Are Dying [Nytefall Trilogy #1]. Bramble, 39.99 hc.

Astraea is a prisoner of her own mind, the past sliding from her grasp like water. But she knows she must escape the tyrannical king who holds her captive and find her clouded memories once again. This quest leads her to the Libertatem, a succession of trials hosted by the king in which five human lands compete for a cycle of safety from the vampires seeking blood, claiming souls, and savaging after dark.

#### • Piper, Hailey. All the Hearts You Eat. Titan, 24.99 tp.

Ivory's life changes irrevocably when she discovers the body of Cabrina Brite on the sands of Cape Morning, along with a mysterious poem. How did she die, and why does it seem she was trying to swim to Ghost Cat Island, the centre of so many local mysteries? Desperate to uncover the answers surrounding Cabrina's death, and haunted by her discovery, Ivory begins to see the pale ghost of Cabrina, only to shake it off as a mere hallucination.

# • Powers, Tim. My Brother's Keeper. Baen, 25.00 tp.

When young Emily Brontë helps a wounded man she finds at the foot of an ancient pagan shrine in the remote Yorkshire moors, her life becomes contentiously entwined with his. He is Alcuin Curzon, embittered member of a sect working to eradicate the resurgent plague of lycanthropy in Europe and northern England. But Emily's father, curate of the Haworth village church, is responsible for having unwittingly brought a demonic werewolf god to Yorkshire forty years ago - and it is taking possession of Emily's beloved but foolish and dissolute brother.

#### • Pullen, Nicholas. The Black Hunger. Redhook, 25.99 tp.

Queer gothic horror. John Sackville will soon be dead. Shadows writhe in the corners of his cell as he mourns the death of his secret lover and the gnawing hunger inside him grows impossible to ignore. He must write his last testament before it is too late. It is a story steeped in history and myth - a journey from stone circles in Scotland, to the barren wilderness of Ukraine where otherworldly creatures stalk the night, ending in the icy peaks of Tibet and Mongolia, where an ancient evil stirs.

Whether you're home for the holly-daze or wandering a hellish landscape of never-ending agony, you need a good tune to pass the time. The dire duo behind the best-selling *The Necronomnom accordingly* present a gruesome grimoire of 25 creepy carols and sinister songs.

#### • Starling, Caitlin. Last to Leave the Room. St. Martin's, 25.00 tp.

The city of San Siroco is sinking. The basement of Dr. Tamsin Rivers, the arrogant, selfish head of the research team assigned to find the source of the subsidence, is sinking faster. As Tamsin grows obsessed with the distorting dimensions of the room at the bottom of the stairs, she finds a door that didn't exist before - and one night, it opens to reveal an exact physical copy of her, but who is sweet and biddable where Tamsin is calculating and cruel.

# • Stephenson, Neal. Polostan. [Bomb Light #1]. Morrow, 39.50 hc.

Born in the American West to a clan of cowboy anarchists, Dawn Rae Bjornberg is raised in Leningrad after the Russian Revolution by her Russian father, a party line Leninist who re-christens her Aurora. She spends her early years in Russia but then grows up as a teenager in Montana, before being drawn into gunrunning and revolution in the streets of

Washington, D.C., during the depths of the Great Depression. Then a surprising revelation forces her to return to Russia, where she is groomed as a spy by the organization that later becomes the KGB.

# • Taub, Melinda. The Scandalous Confessions of Lydia Bennet, Witch. Grand Central, 25.99 tp.

In this exuberant retelling of Jane Austen's *Pride and Prejudice*, Lydia Bennet puts pen to paper to relate the real events and aftermath of the classic story. But Lydia also suffers from entirely different concerns. Her best-loved sister Kitty is really a barn cat; Wickham is every bit as wicked as the world believes him to be, but what else would one expect from a demon? And if Mr. Darcy is uptight about etiquette, that's nothing compared to his feelings about magic. Most of all, Lydia has yet to learn that for a witch, promises have power...
