THE BRITISH SCENE

The scarcity of old fantasy books was evidenced again in a recent motoring holiday in the Yorkshire Dales. I visited a number of old book shops, both in isolated, cobble-streeted villages and modern lakeside resorts and netted a rather meager haul: "The Haunting of Low Fennel", "The Gods of Mars", R. W. Chambers "Tree of Life" and "Tarzan and the Leopard Men". Collectors who order by mail miss half the fun of fantasy collecting -- that of running - down old book shops in back streets and searching the dusty shelves. In the past few weeks I have obtained "Tales of Secret Egypt", Jewels of Opar", "The Devil Doctor", "Moon of Madness" and "Virgin of the Sun" in this way. Only snag is that some of the book-dealers are surprisingly knowledgeable about the values of their wares...

Some of the old stories I was told on my recent holiday would have pleased H.P.L. -- such as the mythical giant Yordas and the quaint "Terrible Knitters of Dent". Yorda's cave, which I visited, is in a gorge - like cleft; sombre pines tower above and whole place has an air of brooding horror. On a hot day cold air curls up in a vaporous mist from the hole -- the breath of the giant in his underground home!

NEW WORLDS - Number 119, June 1962:

The guest editorial isn't quite up to scratch -- Groff Conklin mulling over some of the past editorials and deciding we've lost that sense of wonder....

Minor Operation - by Brian W Aldiss is the first of a 3-part novel - it could be sub-titled "Sex is the Simplest Thing"... British citizens are required to be fitted with a disc in the forehead (a sort of third psi) which glows pink under biological stimulus. There is seduction and sex-play and little more so far -- not my cup of tea!

The Cage of Sand - by J.G. Ballard is beautifully written and contains a plot which is new to me - read it yourself - I won't spoil the plot - here are the snows of yester-year!

Sacrifice - by F.G. Rayer - acceptable "human host" vignette which suffers from o er-condensing but has a new twist. Six-fingered Jacks, Birthright, & Visual Aid - like the jokes in Reader's Digest, they fill up the empty space! Oh yest -- there is a good book review column by Leslie Flood.

SCIENCE FANTASY - Number 54:

A good issue of Britain's best fantasy mag, possibly the best published anywhere today!

Perilous Portal - by Frank Brandon - sequel to the "Seventh Stair" - reminds one of Harold Shea - alternate worlds entered by mathematics - alien beings of "Watkins World" & Porvone invaders portrayed with vivid realism - a great yarn - had me on the edge of my seat.

Kings in Darkness - by Michael Moorcock - a further adventure of Elric of Melnibone and Moonglum. The difference between these two and Fashred and the Grey Mouser is that Leiber brings his characters to life. Mickey Spillane fans will be pleased they don't have to turn many pages before Elric & Zarozimia (she appeared 6 pages back) "drop to the soft turf, oblivious of Moonglum"

Hat Trick - by Colin Denbigh - a man who bought an old hat which turned him into God. Very nice little piece.

The ish is rounded off by a very complete book review column by John Carnell... Unknown is dead; Long live Science Fantasy...! C.R.K.

- FAMOUS FANTASY ARTISTS -

#1 - Lee Brown Coye

November 20th of this year will see an event of considerable interest to fandom
-- the return of Lee Brown Coye to fantasy art after an absence of more than a decade. Hailed by Hannes Bok as "loaded with talent", his work for the old WEIRD
TALES has been described by Virgil Finlay as "very good, in it's own dramatic way"

The December issue of FANTASTIC will be the arena for his comeback, and will have two drawings by him for a story called HERITAGE, a Fantasy Classic by E.J. Derringer. One of them will be a back cover illustration. Eager fans will see a brand new Coye -- still a master of the grotesque, but with far more skill and technique than in the old days. A lucky few who have had an advance look at these drawings have raved about them. And there will be many more to follow...!

Ironically, Lee originally wanted to be an illustrator of children's books. As might well be expected, his talent and approach were not suited for this field. Not sure of his particular niche in the art world, Lee then experimented in many areas. One of the most successful was his historical series based on the Civil War, showing Union and Confederate troops in action. Already under the spell of the influences that were later to make him famous, they all came out as horror illustrations.

These were seen and liked by a friend who had contact with New York publishers Farrar and Rinehart needed no introduction to Coye's work, having published cooperatively in 1939, a book called THE ART OF BUNDLING, a long, monumentally dull history of the courtship practices in Colonial Pennsylvania. Lee's drawings for this book contain virtually all of the very few examples of humor that have ever appeared in his work.

Farrar and Rinehart was then preparing for publication, a collection of fantasy stories edited by August Derleth. Lee was given the job of illustrating this book, which came out in 1944 under the title of SLEEP NO MORE.

Many of the stories in this volume were reprints from WEIRD TALES, and it was necessary for Lee to visit the latter firm's offices to read their back issue files. He spent several days at this task, making notes and pencil sketches. Looking over his shoulder during this time was Lamont Buchanan, WT's associate editor.

Buchanan like what he saw, and asked Lee to do some drawings for WEIRD TALES. His first efforts were published the following year, a black and white illustration for a story called THE CRANBERRY GOBLET. Thus was formed a business association that was to endure for six years.

His early work in WEIRD TALES was rather crude by comparison with what was to come later. As he gradually discovered the potentials of scratchboard, he began turning out the masterpieces of horror that delighted the magazine's readers.

It was necessary at first for Farrar and Rinehart to curb Lee's enthusiasms a bit -- two of his drawings were rejected as too gruesome for publication. One which survives depicts two hanged men, with careful and realistic rendering of their bloated darkened features.

The success of the first Farrar and Rinehart book caused them to publish two more Derleth-edited collections: WHO KNOCKS? (1946) and THE NIGHT SIDE (1947) During this period, Lee was going through a stage of experimentation with abstract art, and this influence is apparent in both books, as well as in his WEIRD TALES work of this time.

Starting in 1947, Lee added a trademark to his drawings that he still uses today -- a crescent moon. It appears in a variety of forms -- a slim, graceful, mathemat ically exact curve, a lop-sided slash, an outline, "the old moon in the new moon's arms", and even a black silhouette on a white background. Often it is in the sky where one might logically expect it, although it may crop up anywhere in the design.

Occasionally it is so carefully concealed that it is not immediately apparent. Highly effective in a fantasy drawing, the crescent moon represents a "C" for Coye.

1947 also saw the first appearance of the very popular WEIRDISMS series. These were full-page drawings, dealing with historical lore about vampires, witches and similar legends, all written in a factual style as though they were the gospel truth. The first few of these were written by E. Crosby Michel of Syracuse, N.Y.; later, when Mrs Michel tired of the task, Lee took over the research himself and continued the series. The composition of many of these, showing various human and non-human figures striving together, is very dramatic.

During the middle 1940's, Lee became interested in medical art, and received special permission to study anatomy at the University of Syracuse Medical School. In this second field of endeavor, he spent many hours watching surgical operations and dissection of cadavers. In his own words, "I saw some pretty horrible things, and it gave me some ideas".

This knowledge also stood him in good stead when in 1951 he left the financially ottering WEIRD TALES. One of his sources of income during this transition period was the making of animated training films for medical schools.

Another part of his income in the 1950's came from the manufacture of models for business and industry. His biggest job was a working model of the Solvay Process, done half realistically and half diagramatically. Seventeen feet long by nine feet wide and four feet high, it is a state owned exhibit in the Educational Building in Albany, New York.

Lee is also an accomplished sculptor in many materials. In addition to carefully - wrought carvings in various woods, he has done liturgical metal work for the Catholic churches.

He is particularily fond of silver. His exhibition at Colgate University last June centered around creations in this metal. The showpiece of this exhibit was a silver centerpiece with a roos ter attached. A photograph reveals it to be a bowl of assymetrical design, with graceful sweeping lines, and polished to a high sheen.

The fantasy aspect seems to intrude in virtually all of his work to varying degrees; he has long ago ceased to fight it. Even his watercolors depict deserted houses, emphasizing decay and desolation -- dark, sinister structures that you wouldn't want to enter without a companion. At present, he is re-creating some of the animal figures from his WEIRDISMS series as silver pendants.

A modest man, Lee speaks deprecatingly of his work, believing it possesses little merit. In this, he is certain to be shouted down by his many fans and admirers. He is one of the very few fantasy artists to have been honored by a listing in WHO'S WHO IN AMERICAN ART. He was also the subject of a feature article in the October 1948 issue of AMERICAN ARTIST.

"We miss Lee Brown Coye". "Where is Coye hiding?" These two extracts are typical of the letters that came to WEIRD TALES after Lee left them in 1951. It took a good many years, but his fans will see him again in November...

The book-trade magazine, "Publishers' Weekly", has granted me permission to publish reproductions of all the Edgar Rice Burroughs book announcements which have appeared in that journal, 1914 to 1962.

Virtually every Burroughs title is here, in a full-page ad. (Some titles have more than one ad.) Many of these contain illustrations by J. Allen St. John and others, and a number of the dust jackets are also pictured.

A few of these publishers' advertisements (not more than 25%) will appear in my "Golden Anniversary Bibliography" described on the opposite side of this sheet. The collection as a whole, however, will be published separately in a stiff-paper-cover booklet of about 100 pages, produced by the photo-offset process.

The McClurg advertisements of the early period are especially fascinating, as they reflect the rising acclaim and demand for Burroughs' works. There is, for instance, a 1914 ad describing six new McClurg books that year, with TARZAN OF THE APES at the very bottom of the list. Two years later, McClurg came out with a double-page, illustrated, advertisement for THE BEASTS OF TARZAN alone.

The major publishers are all here: McClurg, Macaulay, Volland, Metropolitan, Burroughs, A.L.Burt, Grosset & Dunlap — and the complete collection makes a valuable companion piece to the books themselves.

As a special extra feature, this booklet will also include a complete portfolio of the illustrations which J. Allen St. John did (including the magazine covers) for the Burroughs serials in 1941, 1942 and 1943 issues of AMAZING STORIES and FANTASTIC ADVENTURES.

These 10 covers and 34 interior pages were the only magazine work that St. John ever did for Burroughs stories, and not a single one of them ever appeared in book form. Because of their gradual deterioration and ultimate loss on pulp paper now already 20 years old, the Ziff-Davis Publishing Company and Mrs. J. Allen St. John have granted me permission to reproduce these illustrations for posterity.

This unique Edgar Rice Burroughs booklet, containing all the publishers' advertisements and all the St. John magazine artwork, is now in process of preparation and should be ready in October or November, 1962.
