#### -- EDITORIAL --

This month would be as good a time as any to bring up a matter that has arisen since the recent change in Postal Regulations governing the handling of third class mail. Third class will no longer be forwarded and will be returned only when specifically requested... a fee of 8¢ is charged for piece of mail so returned.

A little computation will reveal that this is an expensive procedure for us... a 3rd class subscription of 12 issues for \$1 figures 8-1/3¢ per issue; 4¢ is used for 3rd class postage...an additional 8¢ for a returned issue would total 12¢ for postage alone

In order to reduce this loss, we have decided on the following practice when subscription copies are returned account change of address, uncalled for, etc.:

The returned copy will be held and a post card sent to the subscriber, notifying him that the issue has been returned, while one issue will be deducted from his remaining subscription. If the subscriber wants the returned issue (which may be as much as a month old when returned), he can either send 8¢ in stamps or request an additional issue be deducted from his sub.

We are not particularily happy in doing this, but as yet have been unable to come up with a different solution. Of course, the ideal situation would be to have your notification of address changes in plenty of time to correct your label prior to mailing. # THE BRITISH SCENE by

#### C.R. KEARNS

This month sees the arrival of T.G.L. Cockcroft's "Index to the Weird Fiction Magazines". Publication was first announced about two years ago, in duplicated form, by Fantast (Medway); since then no more had been heard from it. This first edition is printed by John Milne Ltd., Ouba Street, Wellington, New Zealand for Mr. T.G.L. Cockcroft, Lower Hutt, New Zealand and is available from Mr. Cockcroft or Fantast (Medway) at 17/6, plus postage.

The book runs to 56 pages,  $6-1/2 \times 9-1/2$  inches in size, with a glossy paper cover -- being a reproduction of Virgil Finlay's illustration for THE FACELESS GOD by Robert Bloch, Weird Tales, May, 1936.

This is a handsome production, indexing stories by title and is designed to enable one to locate a story or other item in any issue of the titles covered, quite easily and quickly. Magazines covered are: WEIRD TALES, STRANGE TALES of Mystery & Terror, STRANGE STORIES, STRANGE TALES (English), THE THRILL BOOK, ORIENTAL STORIES, MAGIC CARPET, GOLDEN FLEECE. Noticeable absences are GHOST STORIES, TALES OF MAGIC AND MYSTERY and WITCHES TALES.

First comes a magazine listing, issues, page counts, size and price, following this is a listing of editors, then the main part of the work, starting with a seven page listing of magazines, issue by issue, with name of cover artist and title of story illustrated, followed by a fascinating page of "Some General Notes", full of interesting comment on stories and authors -- wherein we can pick up such tidbits as THE CHURCHYARD YEW was not really written by Le Fanu and THE HORROR FROM THE HILLS incorporates Lovecraft's VERY OLD FOLK and much, much more.

The "Index by Title" runs from page fifteen to fifty-three, followed by a list of pseudonyms; the "It Happened to Me" series; pictorial features by Finlay and coye; a listing of serials by title and summary by author, plus a special listing of Seabury Quinn"s articles and stories in WEIRD TALES; as a sort of a bonus there is a short listing of some books and magazines which have reprinted stories mentioned in the index.

"The Index" is printed in clear, readable type in spite of so much information being crow ded onto each page. It is a monumental work which could have only been compiled as a labour of love by someone who was completely dedicated to his task. Many readers will remember Cockcroft's contribution, an addenda to the Carter glossary, in THE SHUTTERED ROOM.

I.F. Clarke of Glasgow University is embarked on quite a writing programme after his TALE OF THE FUTURE and is now collecting such books as O'Cluny's THE MERRY MULTIFLEET and THE MOUNTING MULTICORPS, among others for his projected "Future Wars", and has just written a guest editorial for NEW WORLDS called "SF and the Ragnarok Theme"...about end-of-the-world stories. Speaking of Nova Publications...SCIENCE FICTION AD-VENTURES has folded; Carnell can now concentrate on NEW WORLDS and SCIENCE FANTASY.

Arthur Sellings' TELEPATH is coming out in hard covers, re-titled (by him) THE SILENT SPEAKERS. Arthur, who has a very wide knowledge of the Fantasy and S.F. fields and looks upon himself as a sort of antiquarian futurist, has promised to write an occasional column for 'Fantasy Collector'.

In the few weeks since "The Reader's Guide to Barsoom and Amtor" was announced in a mailing to 250 members of the Burroughs Bibliophiles, almost 100 orders have been placed, and they are still arriving almost daily. In view of this interest, we have decided to extend the offer to a wider public, including the readers of THE FANTASY COLLECTOR. Here is the information.

"The Reader's Guide to Barsoom and Amtor" will be a mimeographed booklet dealing with the planets Barsoom and Amtor -- Mars and Venus -- as visualized in Edgar Rice Burroughs' series of books detailing the adventurous life on those two worlds.
