THE BRITISH SCENE

I feel that a few words about the "Moorcock controversy" are due from me, and think the whole thing can be summed up in three quotations from Mr. Moorcock's letter to me, of 19th July, following my submission of a detailed list of what displeased me in "Dead God's Homecoming":

I quote:

"We are, you see, at odds to begin with. I don't like fantasy -- you do. But we agree on the main issue -- for, to tell the truth I can't read the Elric stories either.

and:

"I find most SF and Fantasy unreadable or, if readable, not very satisfying. Therefore I have read only one Lovecraft story through -- a short piece with a title I forget -- and regard HPL as a hack of the first water."

and:

"I will accept, also, that the quotes in your article were not deliberately garbled."

unquote.

I would add that I only produce these quotes following the publication of MM's remarks in the August issue.

I have always entertained a higher regard for Mr Moorcock's non-fiction work since I read his resume' of juvenile S-F some years ago in "Vector".

SCIENCE FANTASY No. 60 (2/6) and No. 61 (3/-, oh dear!) -- each contains an unpublished MEVYN PEAKE story: "Same Time, Same Place", and "Danse Macabre", respectively.

Carnell states that Mike Moorcock was directly responsible for the 2 stories reaching the editorial desk - so No. 60 contains; "Mervyn Peake, An Appreciation" by Micheal Moorcock. I have previously read a much longer article on Peake in "Folio Magazine", but the present article shows Moorcock to be a keen and informed student of Peake the writer and Peake the artist.

"Same Time, Same Place" is a beautiful, horrible, little piece and worth the price of admission many times over. Quinn's cover illustrating this yarn is a beauty which is just as well as the balance of the yarns in this issue are mediocre.

SCIENCE FANTASY No. 61: Feature novelette is "Black Sword's Brothers" by (surprise!) Michael Moorcock, and concerns someone called Elric of Melnibone who dwells in Karlaak by the Weeping Waste --- NO COMMENT!

Here is also the start of a new series - "Aspects of Fantasy" by (where have I heard that name before?) "MIKE MOORCOCK" - who, we are told - will diagnose the various aspects of many famous writers and their works as applied to the fantasy field as a whole. He quotes from Lovecraft's "Marginalia" (and disagrees with him) and also Jung's "Modern Man in Search of a Soul".

This is the sort of stuff I like and have asked Carnell for -- and Moorcock seems to know what he is talking about -- yes, by all means!

"Danse Macabre" is a nightmarish, horrifying masterpiece which you must read -- this issue, Number 60 will soon be a collector's item.

The November NEW WORLDS (No 136) will also be 3/ and features Colin Kapp's first long novel "The Dark Mind" as a serial. I have left myself little space, but must mention the re-issue in paperback of Dion Fortune's "Demon Lover" (Aquarium 5/-)

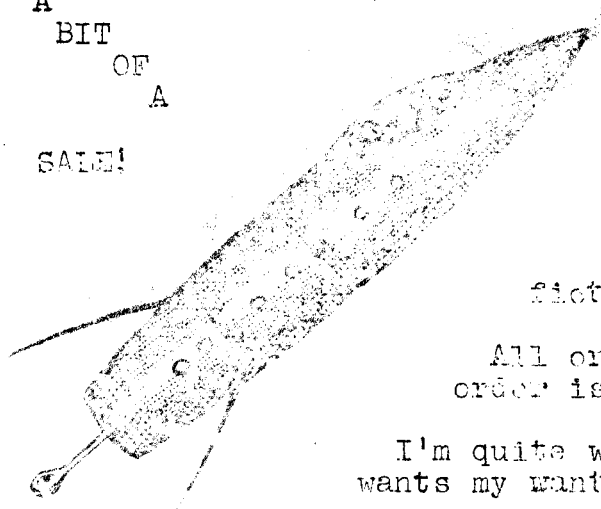
