The delayed deadline for this issue seems to have met with approval, at least to the extent of those who found time to write during what has become the hectic season of the year. We were surprised at the amount of copy received; naturally about half arrived a day or two late -- this is an immutable law & there is nothing that can be done to change it...! One good result was that we should be able to get back on the regular schedule with the next issue; we will extend the deadline to Monday, January 27th, but will try to make the mailing date the regular first of the month for overseas subscribers.

To the start the new year right, we are going to try to mitigate one of the more persistant irritations that has plagued us since we have first started publishing this little effort. Every month there are one or two advertisers who do not send cash with their copy and do not pay when their copy of the mag arrives, forcing us finally to take the time to prepare a bill & bill them. This is the standard business practice, I guess, but on an operation of this nature, when time and cash are always in short supply, it is a doggoned nuisance. We realize that it is often difficult to estimate the amount of space an ad will take from the rough copy, but a simple c check of the rates against the printed advt when it arrives will give the exact amount due. So, effective with the next issue (#64) a 10% extra charge will be made on all accounts that must be especially billed and are not paid by the first of the following month. # THE BRITISH SCENE by C.R. Kearns

The new year is usually the time for counting issues and pages of last year's magazines, but I don't feel like calling a feast with the host in the last stages of suicide...

Nova Publications folds as of March, 1964, after which there will be no original S.F. or Fantasy magazine being published in Britain. "New Worlds" first appeared in 1946 and in 1949, with the formation of Nova Publications, issue #4 hit the stands, the first of Nova's three: "S F Adventures" and "Science Fantasy" completing the trio.

All, to my way of thinking, have been aimed at the teen-aged audience, with "Science Fantasy" sometimes having more mature yarns. Carnell's offerings, never of very high standard, have been slipping sadly of late and I have often wondered who was buying the mags. More recent skimping of covers and contents have told their own tale of the battle being lost. Stories and authors I have thought to be good, and have urged on Carnell, have brought forth lofty, patronising letters telling me they are "difficult to read". The motto seems to have been: "Don't ruffle my teen-age audience"! Let us hope someone will now bring out a good fantasy or weird magazine in this country.

Chuntering generally about magazines, I forcast that "Analog" will be the next to go -- give it six months. After trying to read it's jolly lettercols and science articles, I'm afraid I'm not buying it any more (it costs 70¢ over here!).

"Venture" and "F & SF" are easily obtainable at 2/6; "Galaxy" is all but unobtainable, while "Worlds of Galaxy Rejects" -- beg your pardon -- "Worlds of Tomorrow" can sometimes be found if you search hard.

"Amazing" and "Fantastic" cannot be bought on the newstands but I have no difficulty in getting them regularily from Fantast (Medway)Ltd. Here's where I blush and admit the duo to be my favorites; "Amazing" for Moscowitz's articles and the classic reprints ( and lately ERB new & reprint yarns) and "Fantastic" because it's contents often come near to the old W.T.

Carnell is not finished yet; he is to edit a regular collection of new SF stories for Corgi -- a sort of P.B. mag, like Star SF (I hope!), so British authors will still have an outlet of sorts for their talents.

The latest "Science Fantasy", Number 62, contains a long, long Science Fiction novel by Aldiss, "Skeleton Crew", about the schizophrenic captain of a nuclear freighter who is haunted eternall by the Figure. He wrecks his leviathan on the Skeleton Coast for a schizophrenic reason -- the destruction of mankind!

"Aspects of Fantasy - #2" - "The Floodgates of the Unconscious" by Mike Moorcock has descended below fanzine level. He concentrates on the Gothic Novel, by quoting big chunks from them -- all, no doubt, at so much per word -and Freud, Freud, Freud! He seems to be telling us that we are all "nut-cases" for reading fantasy, that "the forces which the writer may describe as supernatural...are in fact, entirely natural. They are the forces locked in our own skulls". Good high-school psychology, no doubt -- but out of place in an <u>Authoritative Work About Fantasy</u>. I'd like to see this sort of thing done by someone with REAL authority, like Frank Farnell of Ipswich, for example...!

During 1961 and 1962, two friends of Clark Ashton Smith labored together on 36 Sundays at a hand-operated printing press, and separately perhaps twice as many long evenings setting and distributing type, in an attempt to produce a fine, hand-crafted book of CAS's poems.

Although the finished book -- bound by professionals of high repute -- physically falls short of the printers' goal of perfection, it does at least adequately present 46 pages of masterful poetry not available elsewhere. (And, notwithstanding the dissatisfaction of it's printers, the book per se has been given favorable attention by bibliophilic journals, and a majority of it's purchasers have offered embarrassingly enthusiastic praise.)

This book, THE HILL OF DIONYSUS -- A SELECTION, was completed a little over a year ago and was offered for sale in these editions and quantities :

100 copies of the "Regular Edition", hardbound; 65 copies of the same, paperbound; and

15 copies of a "Limited Edition", of superior paper and binding, and with a poem typed & signed by Smith laid in.

Publicity for the book has been meager, wherefore only 32, 34 and 9 copies in the respective editions, have been sold. 68, 31 and 6 copies remain available at their original prices of \$6.50, \$3.75 and \$25.

Obviously no one need rush to buy one; yet, with an eye to the stiff prices commanded by Smith's out-of-print "Sandalwood", "Odes and Sonnets", and "Ebony and Crystal", it is suggested that an indefinetly long delay might be regretted...
