THE 1989 GUFF RACE

(Europe - Swancon 14, Perth, Australia)

Sunday, 20 March 1988

Anyone wishing to stand should supply the UK Administrator with the following:

- Written nominations from 5 active fans, 3 from Europe, 2 from Australia/New Zealand. If you think I may not know any one of the nominators then provide me with the name of someone I could contact to ascertain the 'activity'. In basic terms, the same definition of 'active' will be used for nominators as is used for voting.
- A platform of around 200 words.

- A £5 bond.

- A written commitment that, apart from Acts of God, you will attend the Easter National Convention to be held in Perth in 1989.

All the above must by received by me before the closing date - i.e. your last chance is to call around at 11.59 p.m. on Saturday night. Because of the possible problems with post from Australia, receipt by Irwin of written confirmation from Australian nominees by the deadline (Australian time) will be acceptable.
