These are films of ersatz incompetence, made for a market that is anxious to find new thrills in incompetence.

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Anyway, it is rare that you would see anything on one of these programs that is of a deep nature, but I have to say one I saw really did change my world-view somewhat. They were running documentaries from the 1950s to smirk at. One was one you would see in school about how to behave on a date. But in the middle of all this frivolity they showed an instructional film for dairy farmers and they said, "Yes, cows make friends and have personal favorites just like people do." Big laugh from the audience, but not from me.

I guess I had not given a whole lot of thought to bovine intelligence before this. Apparently cows and bulls and steers (isn't there a single word for these things? They don't break down their species into just "me," "my mother," and "the others," but look at each other as individuals. That Big Mac you are eating could be made up of somebody's best friend.
